HERE at NLP Towers, we love a good fundraiser.

We get to hear of some unbelievable tales of courage and bravery that you, the non-League football supporter, carry out for worthy causes close to your heart. We just wish we could print them all.

Indeed, just in this last fortnight alone, we have run three very incredible fundraising stories which have really touched our hearts. Take Joseph Adams, for one. Joseph, a 21-year-old Altrincham super fan with Down Syndrome, embarked on a gruelling charity challenge, running ten 10ks in five days, across ten different European countries!

Joseph undertook the epic “No Limits” challenge with the aim of raising the £250,000 needed to hire a disability sports officer role as part of Altrincham’s Community Sports charity and establish a programme for children and adults with Special Needs. The challenge culminated in the Altrincham 10K on September 1 where Joseph passed the J. Davidson Stadium –home of his beloved club – to a hero’s welcome, raising a whopping £300,000 along the way.

“Joseph is a truly remarkable young man who volunteers in our town centre store every week and throws himself wholeheartedly into everything he does,” said Alty chief executive Sam Mackenzie.

“We are so proud of him, and it was an unforgettable moment when he walked through the door into the hall to applause all round in what was a symbol of how much emphasis we place on community work and relations here at the football club.” Joseph can be supported by visiting www.gofundme.com/f/josephs-challenge-no-limits

At the same time, our attentions were drawn to the efforts of another fundraising hero going beyond the call of duty, this time in the north-east. Matthew Smith, who plays for Wearside League club Durham FC Corinthians, completed a gruelling 800-mile marathon run via every Premier League stadium in aid of a charity close to his heart.

The 30-year-old was raising money for north-east-based suicide prevention charity, If U Care Share Foundation – the charity he co-founded following the sad passing of his brother Daniel almost 14 years ago.


Starting at AFC Bournemouth’s Vitality Stadium earlier this month, Smith ran over 30 miles per day, through all weathers, before eventually reaching St James’ Park, home of his beloved Newcastle United. The mammoth challenge was instigated after a cut to funding to suicide prevention services was announced with Smith looking to raise an initial £135,000.

“There is still a lot of fundraising to go - there is a long way to go and a big amount to hit,” Smith told *The NLP*. “We will keep trying, I will keep asking – but I’m also realistic, I’ve raised a huge amount of money, it’s not a small amount.

“I am still a little bit in shock to be honest and I think it’s going to take a little while to appreciate what I’ve achieved. It feels brilliant to have special people here and people who have really helped along the way. I couldn’t have done it myself.”

And last, but by no means least, wisecracks aimed at a lycra-clad commercial manager ended up inspiring a mammoth fundraising effort between Step 3 rivals situated almost 200 miles apart – and it may well happen all over again.

Bromsgrove Sporting's commercial guru Matt Foden responded to playful stick over rocking up at a pre-season friendly in his cycling gear by vowing to pedal his way to last month's Southern League Premier Division Central fixture at Lowestoft Town.

The idea blossomed into a fundraiser for Bowel Cancer UK and mental health charity CALM – Campaign Against Living Miserably.

Foden's efforts were inspired by people at Sporting recently affected by bowel cancer and a university friend who died from the disease last year, while CALM has offered help and support to the family of former Bromsgrove player Tom Rankin who took his own life in March 2022.

Having taken the scenic route via the north Norfolk coastline, Foden arrived at Lowestoft to a warm welcome where club officials had the kettle on with fans contributing to the fundraising effort before potentially setting up a rerun.

"The fans at Lowestoft were so friendly and helpful when I arrived, Helen Nixon (director) in particular," said Foden.

"I met a guy there who is into cycling, he is half thinking of doing it in April when they come to our place. If he does, I am thinking of going to meet them there and cycle back to Bromsgrove with them."

More traditional transport options were used to get home in time for Sporting's home clash with Halesowen Town on Monday where more money was raised and further online donations have taken the tally past £3,000 with Gift Aid.

"The response from everyone has been fantastic," added Foden.

As a player Shaka played for Millwall and Chalfont St Peter. A huge influence and strong personality both on and off the pitch. Also responsible for assisting with all coaching sessions.

George Legg (Goalkeeper) Former Reading youngster who joined the Reds in January 2024 from Hanwell Town. Has Football and National League experience. Previous clubs include Chesham United, Gosport Borough, Hungerford Town, Barnet, Boreham Wood and Aldershot Town.

Adam Hassane (Goalkeeper) Local youngster who was previously with Hampton & Richmond Borough as part of their Youth set-up. Made his debut as a second half substitute against Ashford Town (Middlesex) in the FA Cup.

Sam Wheeler (Goalkeeper) Former trialist at Premier League Aston Villa. Sam was previously with Chesham United before signing on at Honeycroft in August 2024. Great shot stopper who made his debut at home against Westfield.

Troy Murray (Defender) Young left sided defender who made his Uxbridge debut in April 2024. Represented Reading at Youth level before joining Binfield.

Bryan Taylor (Defender) Experienced defender who is in his second season at Honeycroft, after joining from Chertsey Town at the beginning of last term. Great crosser of the ball from his natural left-back position.

Jack Mullan (Defender) Started his career with Uxbridge as part of their Youth Team. Made his Reds debut as an eighteen-year-old in November 2009. Played for current manager Danny Edwards at Chalfont St Peter and this commanding central defender has also seen service with Ashford Town (Middlesex) and Wokingham & Embrook.

Austen Edwards (Defender) Centre-half who caught the eye at previous clubs Holmer Green and Holyport. Cool and calm defender with a big future.

James Taylor (Defender) Signed on a dual-registration agreement from Chesham United in September 2024. Former Captain of Hayes & Yeading United's Under 18 Academy side. Strong commanding central defender whose previous clubs include Egham Town, Bedfont Sports, Harrow Borough and Beaconsfield Town.

Casey Boccaro (Defender/Midfield) Versatile player who is comfortable at full-back or midfield. Signed this summer from Virginia Water where he scored important goals from midfield.

Kai Hobbs (Defender) Kai joined Uxbridge on a permanent deal this summer after impressing on loan from Basingstoke Town last term. Classy right full back who looks to have a bright future in the game.

Joshua Addae (Defender) Former Crystal Palace youngster who signed for the Eagles from Langley FC. Fleet footed full-back who likes to get forward. Made his Reds debut at Kingstonian in August 2024.

Alex Witham (Midfield) Former Arsenal youngster who played alongside Jack Wilshire for the Gunners. Talented player who is in his fourth season at Honeycroft. Former player of the year who has made over 100 appearances for the Reds.

Leo Decabo (Midfield) Leo joined The Reds in September 2024 from Hartley Wintney and made an instant impact with two goals on his debut against Pheonix Sports in the FA Trophy. Scored an impressive 22 goals for Burnham last season.

Reece Robins (Midfield) Attacking midfielder who began his career at Walton Casuals. Part of the successful Leighton Town side, played at Badshot Lea last season.

Gregg Hackett (Midfield) Summer signing who played for North Leigh and Risborough Rangers last season. Previously at Thame United where he was regularly amongst the goals during his four seasons at the Oxfordshire club.

Lewis Cole (Midfield) Returned to Honeycroft last season from Harrow Borough and had a great season which saw him crowned player of the year. Combative midfielder who made his Reds debut in 2014 aged nineteen.

George Moore (Midfield) Attacking midfielder who joined us from Harrow Borough in 2023. Last seasons top scorer, which saw him voted Supporters Player of the year. Was regularly amongst the goals at Step 3.

Andrio Brandao (Midfield) Skilful, attacking midfielder who joined from Virginia Water last season. Made a big impression during the latter part of the campaign and everyone at the club is excited to watch his progress this season.

Wilson Chingoka (Midfielder) All action midfielder who joined the club in January 2024. Big personality who has experience at Step 3. Previous clubs include: Nuneaton Borough, Potters Bar Town, Lewes, Bedford Town, Staines Town and Northwood.

Glenn Yala (Defender/Midfield) Played at Chalfont St Peter for Manager Danny Edwards. Vastly experienced player whose versatility makes him a managers dream. Former North Greenford United, Waltham Abbey, Aylesbury, Hanwell Town and Chertsey Town player.

Ada Okorogheye (Forward) Came through the Academy at Slough Town before moving to the United States to study and play "soccer". Played last season at step 3 with Beaconsfield Town. Scored a hat-trick on his Uxbridge debut at Cobham in the FA Cup.

Kritpac Dzimba (Forward) Exciting young attacker who joined this summer after three successful seasons at Holyport. Another youthful player who the Reds supporters are looking forward to watching his progress over the coming months.

UXBRIDGE FC CLUB HISTORY

In the late 19th century, the game of "football" was growing in popularity and on the 3rd February 1871 a group of eminent local businessmen held the inaugural meeting of Uxbridge Football Club. A local solicitor, Mr. William Gardiner, was elected as the Club's President and the club's colours were chosen as white shirts with a light blue Maltese cross and a light blue velvet cap with silver tassel. Friendly games against local opposition were played in the early years, until the FA Cup was entered in 1873. A First Round Victory over Gitanos set up a Second-Round tie against eventual finalists Royal Engineers, which the Engineers narrowly won 2-1. It was at this time that Uxbridge could boast amongst its ranks a Full England International. Hubert Heron played for England on two occasions whilst an Uxbridge player before he moved to Wanderers FC where he gained further international honours. His brother Francis, formerly of Uxbridge, also played for England after joining him at Wanderers FC. The club changed its colours to Oxford Blue and Cambridge Blue shirts in 1874, but they were in financial difficulties and folded later that year.

The main problem for Uxbridge was the lack of a permanent home ground (a problem that was to plague them until the middle of the next century), the committee searched the town for a suitable base but were thwarted at every turn and they led a nomadic existence, moving ground every few years. The enthusiasm for a team in Uxbridge was still prevalent and the Club was reformed in 1879. In 1886 Uxbridge FC amalgamated with another local club, Uxbridge Crescents, and played under this name in season 1886/87, before reverting to plain old Uxbridge the following season. It was at this time that the Red Shirts, which are still worn today, were adopted and the nickname "The Reds" was born. Their first trophy was won in 1889 when they lifted the West Middlesex Cup, defeating Colnbrook 1-0 in the Final. The end of the 19th century was a particularly successful period for The Reds as they won the West Middlesex Cup on three further occasions and also won the prestigious Middlesex Senior Cup twice. In 1894 they beat the 3rd Grenadier Guards 2-0 and repeated that success two years later with a 3-2 victory over local rivals Southall in a replay in front of over 5000 spectators. The outstanding achievement however was in reaching the final of the F.A. Amateur Cup in 1898. This was the club's first season in the competition, and they had to win eight ties before meeting Middlesborough in the final at Crystal Palace. Unfortunately, their Northeast rivals proved too strong for them on the day and ran out 2-0 winners. During this successful period for the club, they became founder members of Division Two of the Southern League in 1894, finishing fourth in their first four seasons. However, in season 1898/99 they finished next to bottom and the dwindling crowds (averaging around 500) meant that financially the club was once again in trouble. A decision was therefore taken to withdraw from the Southern League and join the local Middlesex League to try and stabilise the club. However, a majority of the more talented players joined other clubs, and they struggled in their new surroundings, finishing bottom with only one point from their 14 games. At the end of the season the club had a deficit of £130 and with few players the club once again folded.

For two years much fund raising amongst the local community finally saw the club's debts paid and the reformed Uxbridge FC joined the West Middlesex League for the 1902/03 season. In 1904 the Great Western Suburban League was entered and here they stayed until the outbreak of the First World War. Their best finish during this period was as Runners-up to Brentford Reserves in 1910/11. They also won the Middlesex Charity Cup on two occasions in 1908 and 1913, as they looked to re-establish themselves as a force in the football world. Following the end of hostilities Uxbridge joined the Athenian League and added "Town" to their name. An unsuccessful first Athenian League campaign saw them relegated back to the Great Western Suburban League in 1920.

A successful four seasons saw them back in the Athenian League in 1924 where they remained until 1937. The Middlesex Charity Cup was won for the third time in 1935 as Finchley were beaten 4-3.

Two poor seasons saw them finish bottom of the Athenian League in 1936 and 1937 and the club failed to be re-elected. They joined the Spartan League for the 1937/38 season, dropping "Town" from their name at the end of the campaign stood proudly at the summit. Championship celebrations, however, were cut short when it was discovered that The Reds had played an ineligible player and were deduced six points, placing them in third position behind Champions Marlow.

Following the debacle of their one and only season in the Spartan League they resigned and joined the London League prior to the Second World War. During the war years they continued to play and joined the newly formed Great Western Combination League before re-joining the London League in 1945, finishing as Runners-up to Edgware Town.

Uxbridge were founder members of the Corinthian League in 1946 and remained in this league for the next seventeen years. Finally, in 1948, after over three quarters of a century of searching, a ground of their own was purchased. A piece of land in Cleveland Road, Cowley was bought for £5,800 by then President Mr. W.S. Try. The ground was named after a large house that stood on the land and "Honeycroft" was the new home of Uxbridge Football Club. During this period, they won their only Championship to-date when they were crowned Corinthian League Champions at the end of the 1959/60 season. They also won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the third time in 1951 when they defeated Hayes 2-1.

This was a successful period in the club's history as they finished in the top five of the Corinthian League on no less than eight occasions and crowds were averaging around the thousand mark. A re-organisation of non-League football saw the end of the Corinthian League in 1963, and the club found itself once again in Division One of the Athenian League. This was a lean time for The Reds, they were relegated to Division Two in 1967 and financial problems once again beset them. They gained national publicity in 1976 when England were looking for a side to play as part of their warmup for the forthcoming World Cup campaign. Uxbridge took on a full-strength England at Wembley, losing 8-0. The ground problems that had blighted Uxbridge throughout their history surfaced once again and the club had to find a new home. In 1978 they moved to their current headquarters in Horton Road, Yiewsley. A former works Sports & Social Club they have developed the site to the superb standard you see today.

Over the past 43 years they have added floodlights (opened by the visit of Arsenal in 1981), new stands, fencing and in more recent times a new clubhouse was opened and car park laid. On the playing front the club won the Middlesex Charity Cup for the fourth time in 1982, their first silverware for 31 years, and moved to the Isthmian League in the same year, winning promotion to Division One in 1985. The Final of the AC Delco Cup (League Cup) was reached in 1986, where they met Premier Division Champions Sutton United. The Reds failed to stop Sutton completing "The Double" though, losing 3-1 in the Final in front of over a thousand spectators at Imber Court, the home of Metropolitan Police FC, Uxbridge entered the London Challenge Cup for the first time in the 1992/93 season and hence followed a love affair between the Reds and the magnificent trophy. In the eight seasons they entered the competition they reached five finals, winning on three occasions in 1994, 1997 and 2000.

They won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the fourth time in 2001, defeating Harrow Borough 3-0 in the Final held at Honeycroft. In 2004 the club were moved across the pyramid to the Southern League and have reached the Play-Offs on three occasions. In 2004/05 they lost on penalties, after leading Maldon Town in extra-time, in 2007/08 they narrowly lost 0-1 at Oxford City and in 2011/12 they lost 2-1 at Bedworth United in the Semi-Finals. In 2018 Uxbridge were moved back across the pyramid, re-joining the Isthmian League in the South-Central Division.

In 2019 Uxbridge appointed only their sixth manager in over fifty years. Ron Clack was in charge for 18 years from 1970, followed by Peter Marshall for one season, Michael Harvey for three, before George Talbot took the reins for fourteen seasons in 1992. In 2006 Tony Choules became the man in charge, being replaced by our current manager Danny Edwards in 2019. Danny is a UEFA A licensed coach who spent 15 years as manager of Chalfont St Peter AFC. He steered Chalfont St Peter to Step 4 of the league system in 2011, as well as reaching the 3rd Qualifying Round of the Football Association Challenge Cup on three occasions. Danny has with him a confident team which includes Fred Cummings as his Assistant Manager. Fred is well known to the followers of the Red Army as a combative centre half with 320 First Team appearances for Uxbridge in the 1980's. The Middlesex Chairty Cup was won for the 8th time in 2022, with a 2-0 victory over Hanwell Town. This feat was repeated last season when North Greenford United were defeated 2-1 in the final at Bedfont Sports.

In recent times the club has mourned the passing of several club stalwarts. President Alan Odell, who had been associated with The Reds for eighty years, in 2016. Chairman Alan Holloway in 2021 and the club's long-standing Treasurer, David Tucker, passed away in 2022. "Mr. Uxbridge" had been associated with the club for over 50 years and was a massive influence in the running of Uxbridge Football Club.

From his legacy the club have been able to undertake the installation of a state-of-the-art 3G pitch, upgraded LED floodlights, a new 158-seat stand, dug-outs and both pitch-surround and perimeter fencing. More improvements are planned!

Harry Cawdron – Goalkeeper

Harry returns to Badshot Lea FC after a good first season with us last year. An excellent shot stopper and as comfortable with the ball at his feet as any of the outfield players. Its great to have him back in pink! Now 21, Harry came to Badshot Lea via Camberley Town where he was on dual reg with Walton & Hersham. The keeper who comes from Dorking was previously with Leatherhead and before that a former product of the Crystal Palace Academy.

Derek Luzinda – Defender

A new signing for 24/25 season, Derek was at QPR as a youth, joining them at the age of 14 and previous to that was at Reading . Luzinda was born in England but has Ugandan parents and dreams one day of representing Uganda Internationally. A strong and quick right back who likes to get forward and not shy to shoot, Derek will be a welcome addition to the new look Baggies squad.

Callum Wiltshire – Defender

Callum was exceptional for The Baggies last season and won our ‘Young Player of the Year’ award at the end of the 2023/24 campaign. A player who proved very consistent in his performances, Callum played in a number of positions when called on but normally can be seen as a centre back. When he was 16 years of age, he made is first team debut at Camberley Town in the FA Cup, previous to joining Camberley, Wiltshire was a member of the dis-banded Brentford FC Academy. He also had a term at QPR in their youth set up.

George Winkworth – Defender

Young George is a product of last years double winning Under 18’s side at Badshot Lea but was called up and selected to play for the first team on a handful of occasions and excelled. To gain experience, he was loaned to Alton FC in step 5 and impressed there too. Despite his age, he is mature in performances and we are really looking forward to see how he progresses this season.

Nathaniel Kenlock – Defender

Formally at Chipstead FC, Nath impressed and became ‘one to note’ for the Badshot Lea management in the two games against us last season. Very rarely could the Baggies ‘wide’ players get past him in both games and was one of the first targets to get signed. Strong, quick and very good defensively, Kenlock has also spent some time at Redhill FC, Sutton Common Rovers, AFC Croydon and Ashford Town. As a youngster he was part of the Fulham FC Academy.

Abdullah Khalili – Defender

Another new signing for Badshot Lea, this time from Rusthall FC who compete in the South Counties East Division (step 5). The defender spent one season at Rusthall after signing from Rising Ballers FC in 2022. Not to be confused with his namesake, the Swedish International who played for Olympiakos!

Joseph Throp – Defender

This newcomer who can play at the back or in midfield, was signed by Messrs Smith and Ocansey after impressing in pre-season. Joseph joins us from Aldershot Town where last season he was a regular in their U21 side and in a couple of trial games, showed loads of strength, ability on the ball but more importantly desire and a great attitude which was one of the reasons Badshot Lea were keen to sign him. Previous to Aldershot Town, Joseph was with Sutton United in their under 18’s set up.

Luke Phair – Midfielder

A central midfielder who moves up a grade after playing for Fleet Town last campaign. Likes to get on the ball and an excellent passer of it. He can also be dangerous delivering set pieces. Prior to signing for Fleet, Luke spent the 2022/23 season at Leatherhead and before that a year in the Woking Under 23 squad. Luke also made two appearances for Sheerwater whilst on loan in 2023.

Jeremy Kyezu – Midfielder

Everyone who was at the 4-1 pre-season win over Chertsey Town a month ago wanted to know who trialist B was after two spectacular goals. After a couple of trial outings, Badshot Lea swapped to sign Jeremy who last season was at Harrow Borough. Previous to that he was at Tottenham Hotspur and despite not making the first team squad, made four U23 appearances before being released in December 2021. Three months later he trialled and played for Wigan Athletic U23's against ex Westfield FC player Jordan Alves who was also trialling but for Coventry City.

Kai Allsopp – Midfielder

Badshot Lea are delighted to retain Kai after a fantastic season last year despite a campaign that was injury hit. On loan from Slough Town last time around, Kai is now a fully signed Baggie. A delight to watch on the ball, Allsopp was previously at Beaconsfield and the Reading FC Academy.

Aitor Andon Pasantes – Midfielder

Signed from Step 5 Burnham, Aitor is a brave and comfortable central midfielder who impressed pre-season. He played in 37 games last season scoring 5 goals for the Buckinghamshire club where they just failed to win promotion and previous to that played for FC Deportivo Galicia making eleven starts the season before.

Baback Dehgani – Midfielder

Possibly the most technically gifted player in the squad he is a joy to watch. The 25-year-old Dutch midfielder was born in Amsterdam and signed for Badshot Lea pre-season last year from Northwood. Has had previous spells at Woodford and Egham Town, Babs lives in Hendon and is an Arsenal supporter.

David Garlinge – Midfielder

David was the pick of the crop of last seasons double winning Badshot Lea under 18's, so much so that he has already made a number of first team appearances at the latter part of last season and despite his age looked more than comfortable stepping up. Freddie Bailey – Forward

Moves to Badshot Lea this season from Kingstonian FC after excelling in their under 18 set up and after reaching 100 games for their young squad culminated in some first team games for the Step 3 side last term. Hardworking with a great attitude and good technical ability see's him instantly fit in to the way that manager and coach alike want to play. As Gav Smith said 'A very easy decision to get Freddie aboard.' Last season Freddie had a loan spell at Burnham FC.

Jaheim Kamara – Forward

Another bright prospect who first team coach Victor Ocansey did well to beat off others wanting to sign this exciting player. Jaheim was at Sutton United last season playing in their under 19's appearing nine times and scoring twice. Described as having an 'exciting playing style' he has so far shown his ability on the ball beating opposing players in the most Impossible situations.

Harvey Harry – Forward

Harvey signs this year from Thatcham Town. His quick, direct and technical play was spotted by the management and he will have a massive impact on the team's attacking front this season. Harvey started at Slough Town and had a loan deal with Southall last year. Previous to that he was at Bracknell Town and Binfield.



History of Badshot Lea FC

Early history suggests that the village football club was formed in 1904, after a meeting at the local village hall. They initially played friendly matches before deciding that they affiliate to the Surrey County Football Association in 1907. They began life in the junior leagues before gradually progressing through the leagues. The most recent history shows the Lea playing in the Aldershot leagues and progressing through the various divisions, eventually obtaining promotion to the Surrey Intermediate League Western in 1978.

Progress through the three divisions saw the Lea eventually promoted to the Surrey Premier League in 1986. This was for one year only as we obtained the dubious distinction of being relegated with the highest points total ever achieved by a side being relegated.

Season 1988 saw us again in the Surrey Intermediate League Western. The ensuing years saw the difficulties that one experiences until season 2002/03 which saw eventual promotion to Senior Football via The Hellenic League. This was not without its problems as The FA at Soho Square tried to block the move. It was only the determination of the committee and the full backing of The Hellenic League that eventually saw us given the green light along with London APSA (Essex Senior League) and Sporting Bengal (Kent League). In our first season we took time to adjust to Senior Football eventually finishing 4th from bottom under the guidance of manager Maurice Gregory.

In 1997 the first Youth Team joined the Club, and this saw the beginning of the successful Youth and Colts section of the Club. We increased from one team to over 20 and were given extra facility to accommodate this success. For season 2017/18 we started a groundshare arrangement at Camberley Town whilst our new ground was under construction. In October 2017, Michael Charles resigned, and we turned to ex-manager Mark Thomas who successfully led us to immediate promotion back to the Premier Division at the end of the 2017/18 season. Sadly, Mark had to resign his duties and after an extensive search and interview process, we appointed the successful Keith Hills, from fellow Premier Division team Knaphill, to lead us back into the Premier Division for season 2018/19.

In December 2018 we appointed a management team of Gav Smith/Dave Ford as Joint Managers along with Paul Harkness as coach and Dan Bailey as assistant. They galvanised the squad and finished in an excellent 9th place.

In season 2021/22 we finished in the highest position of 5th in the Combined Counties Premier Division South and were the only team to win away to Jersey in the league and in the following season we gained promotion to Step 4 for the first time in our history having finished as one of the highest runners up nationally on PPG.

Currently under the management of Gavin Smith assisted by Dan Bailey and First Team coach Vic Ocansey, we are now members of the Isthmian League South Central League in our first season at Step 4 of the Non-League Pyramid.
