HOW many times do you hear about the next Jamie Vardy? Everyone is on the look-out for the diamond in the rough who could be a lottery ticket to super stardom.

What the Leicester City striker has achieved since leaving Fleetwood Town all those years ago – a Premier League title and appearances at major tournaments with England – is comic book stuff.

It's guaranteed there will be a handful of players playing Non-League football this weekend who will be playing in the Premier League or Championship in the very near future.

The reality is there will be many more dreams that aren't realised. But that doesn't mean it ends there. And there are some pretty inspiring stories when it comes to the world of coaching.

You may have seen recently that Andy Mangan, promoted into the Football League with Accrington Stanley, Fleetwood Town and Tranmere Rovers, was on the verge of joining the coaching staff at Real Madrid!

Anyone who has ever met Mangan will be able to tell you what a lively, bubbly character he is and how much he loves football.

Mangan, the story goes, impressed Madrid boss Carlo Ancelotti's son Davide on their Pro Licence course and they wanted to take the current Stockport County coach to the Bernabeu.

Frustratingly for Mangan, the move has fallen through because of a work permit. But his time will surely come.

NLP columnist – and former professional footballer – Gregor Robertson, wrote about Mangan's rise in last week's paper.

Gregor highlighted how football has finally caught up to the idea that the best coaches aren't always the people who have been at the top in their playing days. It does, however, show, the levels former players can potentially reach.

Gregor talks about Anthony Barry – who played for Wrexham, Fleetwood Town and Forest Green in Non-League – and all he has achieved since hanging up his playing boots.

"To master the art of facing audiences, he had taken it upon himself to give talks and coach in a Liverpool prison, in schools. He even hired a presentation coach and joined a speakers' club," Gregor writes.

"A few years later, he was Paul Cook's assistant coach at Wigan Athletic, and the youngest member on the Pro Licence course with the FA. With the likes of Frank Lampard and Michael Carrick in his cohort, he knew he had to do something different to stand out. The dissertation he produced – The Undervalued Set Piece, for which he studied 16,380 throw-ins – did just that, earning him the class's top mark when he graduated.

"When Lampard was handed the Chelsea job, he gave Barry the chance of a lifetime too. And so began a remarkable journey, from Champions League glory to the Bundesliga and Bayern Munich with Thomas Tuchel, and a World Cup and Euros with Belgium and Portugal respectively alongside Roberto Martinez."

It's incredible to see how much Barry is achieving at the elite levels of the game and all credit to him.

So, the question isn't just who is the next Jamie Vardy, but who is the next Anthony Barry?

Former midfielder who has over 15 years of Football League experience as a player with Birmingham City, Sheffield United, Watford, Portsmouth, Derby County, Notts County and Bristol City. As a Manager/Coach he was previously with Aldershot Town, Wycombe Wanderers, Reading, Torquay United, Basingstoke Town and Staines Town. Joined the coaching staff at Honeycroft during the 2023/24 season.

JOHN CARROLL – COACH

John came from Chalfont St Peter with Danny Edwards in 2019. An UEFA B Licence coach who captained the successful Chalfont St Peter side that won promotion to step 4. Previous clubs include Beaconsfield Town and Luton Town.

SHAKA MUGHAL – GOALKEEPING COACH

As a player Shaka played for Millwall and Chalfont St Peter. A huge influence and strong personality both on and off the pitch. Also responsible for assisting with all coaching sessions.

JOSEPH PEACOCK – PHYSIO

Joined the club at the beginning of the 2022/23 season. An integral member of the management team who is responsible for players recovery. A fully qualified Physio his support is vital on matchdays.

COLIN FINCH – LOGISTICS MANAGER / CLUB SECRETARY

The most important member of the group! Without Colin's support the group is unable to operate as professionally as it does. Responsible for all key issues in and around the changing room. Previously at Chalfont St Peter, Rayners Lane and North Greenford United.

Responsible for all recordings of Uxbridge FC games. Supports in and around all training sessions and on matchdays.

George Legg (Goalkeeper) Former Reading youngster who joined the Reds in January 2024 from Hanwell Town. Has Football and National League experience. Previous clubs include Chesham United, Gosport Borough, Hungerford Town, Barnet, Boreham Wood and Aldershot Town.

Adam Hassane (Goalkeeper) Local youngster who was previously with Hampton & Richmond Borough as part of their Youth set-up. Made his debut as a second half substitute against Ashford Town (Middlesex) in the FA Cup.

Sam Wheeler (Goalkeeper) Former trialist at Premier League Aston Villa. Sam was previously with Chesham United before signing on at Honeycroft in August 2024. Great shot stopper who made his debut at home against Westfield.

Troy Murray (Defender) Young left sided defender who made his Uxbridge debut in April 2024. Represented Reading at Youth level before joining Binfield.

Bryan Taylor (Defender) Experienced defender who is in his second season at Honeycroft, after joining from Chertsey Town at the beginning of last term. Great crosser of the ball from his natural left-back position.

Jack Mullan (Defender) Started his career with Uxbridge as part of their Youth Team. Made his Reds debut as an eighteen-year-old in November 2009. Played for current manager Danny Edwards at Chalfont St Peter and this commanding central defender has also seen service with Ashford Town (Middlesex) and Wokingham & Embrook.

Austen Edwards (Defender) Centre-half who caught the eye at previous clubs Holmer Green and Holyport. Cool and calm defender with a big future.

James Taylor (Defender) Signed on a dual-registration agreement from Chesham United in September 2024. Former Captain of Hayes & Yeading United's Under 18 Academy side. Strong commanding central defender whose previous clubs include Egham Town, Bedfont Sports, Harrow Borough and Beaconsfield Town.

Casey Boccaro (Defender/Midfield) Versatile player who is comfortable at full-back or midfield. Signed this summer from Virginia Water where he scored important goals from midfield.

Kai Hobbs (Defender) Kai joined Uxbridge on a permanent deal this summer after impressing on loan from Basingstoke Town last term. Classy right full back who looks to have a bright future in the game.

Joshua Addae (Defender) Former Crystal Palace youngster who signed for the Eagles from Langley FC. Fleet footed full back who likes to get forward. Made his Reds debut at Kingstonian in August 2024.

Alex Witham (Midfield) Former Arsenal youngster who played alongside Jack Wilshire for the Gunners. Talented player who is in his fourth season at Honeycroft. Former player of the year who has made over 100 appearances for the Reds.

Leo Decabo (Midfield) Leo joined The Reds in September 2024 from Hartley Wintney and made an instant impact with two goals on his debut against Pheonix Sports in the FA Trophy. Scored an impressive 22 goals for Burnham last season.

Reece Robins (Midfield) Attacking midfielder who began his career at Walton Casuals. Part of the successful Leighton Town side, played at Badshot Lea last season.

Gregg Hackett (Midfield) Summer signing who played for North Leigh and Risborough Rangers last season. Previously at Thame United where he was regularly amongst the goals during his four seasons at the Oxfordshire club.

Lewis Cole (Midfield) Returned to Honeycroft last season from Harrow Borough and had a great season which saw him crowned player of the year. Combative midfielder who made his Reds debut in 2014 aged nineteen.

George Moore (Midfield) Attacking midfielder who joined us from Harrow Borough in 2023. Last season's top scorer, which saw him voted Supporters Player of the year. Was regularly amongst the goals at Step 3.

Andrio Brandao (Midfield) Skilful, attacking midfielder who joined from Virginia Water last season. Made a big impression during the latter part of the campaign and everyone at the club is excited to watch his progress this season.

Wilson Chingoka (Midfielder) All action midfielder who joined the club in January 2024. Big personality who has experience at Step 3. Previous clubs include Nuneaton Borough, Potters Bar Town, Lewes, Bedford Town, Staines Town and Northwood.

Glenn Yala (Defender/Midfield) Played at Chalfont St Peter for Manager Danny Edwards. Vastly experienced player whose versatility makes him a managers dream. Former North Greenford United, Waltham Abbey, Aylesbury, Hanwell Town and Chertsey Town player.

Ada Okorogheye (Forward) Came through the Academy at Slough Town before moving to the United States to study and play "soccer". Played last season at step 3 with Beaconsfield Town. Scored a hat-trick on his Uxbridge debut at Cobham in the FA Cup.

Kritpac Dzimba (Forward) Exciting young attacker who joined this summer after three successful seasons at Holyport. Another youthful player who the Reds supporters are looking forward to watching his progress over the coming months.

UXBRIDGE FC CLUB HISTORY

In the late 19th century, the game of "football" was growing in popularity and on the 3rd February 1871 a group of eminent local businessmen held the inaugural meeting of Uxbridge Football Club. A local solicitor, Mr. William Gardiner, was elected as the Club's President and the club's colours were chosen as white shirts with a light blue Maltese cross and a light blue velvet cap with silver tassel.

Friendly games against local opposition were played in the early years, until the FA Cup was entered in 1873. A First Round Victory over Gitanos set up a Second-Round tie against eventual finalists Royal Engineers, which the Engineers narrowly won 2-1. It was at this time that Uxbridge could boast amongst its ranks a Full England International. Hubert Heron played for England on two occasions whilst an Uxbridge player before he moved to Wanderers FC where he gained further international honours. His brother Francis, formerly of Uxbridge, also played for England after joining him at Wanderers FC. The club changed its colours to Oxford Blue and Cambridge Blue shirts in 1874, but they were in financial difficulties and folded later that year.

The main problem for Uxbridge was the lack of a permanent home ground (a problem that was to plague them until the middle of the next century), the committee searched the town for a suitable base but were thwarted at every turn and they led a nomadic existence, moving ground every few years. The enthusiasm for a team in Uxbridge was still prevalent and the Club was reformed in 1879. In 1886 Uxbridge FC amalgamated with another local club, Uxbridge Crescents, and played under this name in season 1886/87, before reverting to plain old Uxbridge the following season. It was at this time that the Red Shirts, which are still worn today, were adopted and the nickname "The Reds" was born. Their first trophy was won in 1889 when they lifted the West Middlesex Cup, defeating Colnbrook 1-0 in the Final. The end of the 19th century was a particularly successful period for The Reds as they won the West Middlesex Cup on three further occasions and also won the prestigious Middlesex Senior Cup twice. In 1894 they beat the 3rd Grenadier Guards 2-0 and repeated that success two years later with a 3-2 victory over local rivals Southall in a replay in front of over 5000 spectators. The outstanding achievement however was in reaching the final of the F.A. Amateur Cup in 1898. This was the club's first season in the competition, and they had to win eight ties before meeting Middlesborough in the final at Crystal Palace. Unfortunately, their Northeast rivals proved too strong for them on the day and ran out 2-0 winners. During this successful period for the club, they became founder members of Division Two of the Southern League in 1894, finishing fourth in their first four seasons. However, in season 1898/99 they finished next to bottom and the dwindling crowds (averaging around 500) meant that financially the club was once again in trouble. A decision was therefore taken to withdraw from the Southern League and join the local Middlesex League to try and stabilise the club. However, a majority of the more talented players joined other clubs, and they struggled in their new surroundings, finishing bottom with only one point from their 14 games. At the end of the season the club had a deficit of £130 and with few players the club once again folded.

For two years much fund raising amongst the local community finally saw the club's debts paid and the reformed Uxbridge FC joined the West Middlesex League for the 1902/03 season. In 1904 the Great Western Suburban League was entered and here they stayed until the outbreak of the First World War. Their best finish during this period was as Runners-up to Brentford Reserves in 1910/11. They also won the Middlesex Charity Cup on two occasions in 1908 and 1913, as they looked to re-establish themselves as a force in the football world. Following the end of hostilities Uxbridge joined the Athenian League and added "Town" to their name. An unsuccessful first Athenian League campaign saw them relegated back to the Great Western Suburban League in 1920.

A successful four seasons saw them back in the Athenian League in 1924 where they remained until 1937. The Middlesex Charity Cup was won for the third time in 1935 as Finchley were beaten 4-3.

Two poor seasons saw them finish bottom of the Athenian League in 1936 and 1937 and the club failed to be re-elected. They joined the Spartan League for the 1937/38 season, dropping "Town" from their name at the end of the campaign stood proudly at the summit. Championship celebrations, however, were cut short when it was discovered that The Reds had played an ineligible player and were deducted six points, placing them in third position behind Champions Marlow.

Following the debacle of their one and only season in the Spartan League they resigned and joined the London League prior to the Second World War. During the war years they continued to play and joined the newly formed Great Western Combination League before re-joining the London League in 1945, finishing as Runners-up to Edgware Town.

Uxbridge were founder members of the Corinthian League in 1946 and remained in this league for the next seventeen years. Finally, in 1948, after over three quarters of a century of searching, a ground of their own was purchased. A piece of land in Cleveland Road, Cowley was bought for £5,800 by then President Mr. W.S. Try. The ground was named after a large house that stood on the land and "Honeycroft" was the new home of Uxbridge Football Club. During this period, they won their only Championship to-date when they were crowned Corinthian League Champions at the end of the 1959/60 season. They also won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the third time in 1951 when they defeated Hayes 2-1.

This was a successful period in the club's history as they finished in the top five of the Corinthian League on no less than eight occasions and crowds were averaging around the thousand mark. A re-organisation of non-League football saw the end of the Corinthian League in 1963, and the club found itself once again in Division One of the Athenian League. This was a lean time for The Reds, they were relegated to Division Two in 1967 and financial problems once again beset them. They gained national publicity in 1976 when England were looking for a side to play as part of their warmup for the forthcoming World Cup campaign. Uxbridge took on a full-strength England at Wembley, losing 8-0. The ground problems that had blighted Uxbridge throughout their history surfaced once again and the club had to find a new home. In 1978 they moved to their current headquarters in Horton Road, Yiewsley. A former works Sports & Social Club they have developed the site to the superb standard you see today.

Over the past 43 years they have added floodlights (opened by the visit of Arsenal in 1981), new stands, fencing and in more recent times a new clubhouse was opened and car park laid. On the playing front the club won the Middlesex Charity Cup for the fourth time in 1982, their first silverware for 31 years, and moved to the Isthmian League in the same year, winning promotion to Division One in 1985. The Final of the AC Delco Cup (League Cup) was reached in 1986, where they met Premier Division Champions Sutton United. The Reds failed to stop Sutton completing "The Double" though, losing 3-1 in the Final in front of over a thousand spectators at Imber Court, the home of Metropolitan Police FC, Uxbridge entered the London Challenge Cup for the first time in the 1992/93 season and hence followed a love affair between the Reds and the magnificent trophy. In the eight seasons they entered the competition they reached five finals, winning on three occasions in 1994, 1997 and 2000.


They won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the fourth time in 2001, defeating Harrow Borough 3-0 in the Final held at Honeycroft. In 2004 the club were moved across the pyramid to the Southern League and have reached the Play-Offs on three occasions. In 2004/05 they lost on penalties, after leading Maldon Town in extra-time, in 2007/08 they narrowly lost 0-1 at Oxford City and in 2011/12 they lost 2-1 at Bedworth United in the Semi-Finals. In 2018 Uxbridge were moved back across the pyramid, re-joining the Isthmian League in the South-Central Division.

In 2019 Uxbridge appointed only their sixth manager in over fifty years. Ron Clack was in charge for 18 years from 1970, followed by Peter Marshall for one season, Michael Harvey for three, before George Talbot took the reins for fourteen seasons in 1992. In 2006 Tony Choules became the man in charge, being replaced by our current manager Danny Edwards in 2019. Danny is a UEFA A licensed coach who spent 15 years as manager of Chalfont St Peter AFC. He steered Chalfont St Peter to Step 4 of the league system in 2011, as well as reaching the 3rd Qualifying Round of the Football Association Challenge Cup on three occasions. Danny has with him a confident team which includes Fred Cummings as his Assistant Manager. Fred is well known to the followers of the Red Army as a combative centre half with 320 First Team appearances for Uxbridge in the 1980's. The Middlesex Chairty Cup was won for the 8th time in 2022, with a 2-0 victory over Hanwell Town. This feat was repeated last season when North Greenford United were defeated 2-1 in the final at Bedfont Sports.

In recent times the club has mourned the passing of several club stalwarts. President Alan Odell, who had been associated with The Reds for eighty years, in 2016. Chairman Alan Holloway in 2021 and the club's long-standing Treasurer, David Tucker, passed away in 2022. "Mr. Uxbridge" had been associated with the club for over 50 years and was a massive influence in the running of Uxbridge Football Club.

From his legacy the club have been able to undertake the installation of a state-of-the-art 3G pitch, upgraded LED floodlights, a new 158-seat stand, dug-outs and both pitch-surround and perimeter fencing. More improvements are planned!

Amadou Tangara 27 years old

Debut – August 2024

An experienced goalkeeper who has been a fans favourite wherever he has played during his career. Clubs include Dulwich Hamlet, Horsham, Margate and Leatherhead amongst others. He joined during the closed season ahead of the first campaign at Step 4.

DEFENDERS

Finley Marjoram 18 years old

Debut: August 24

Talented full back currently on loan from Crystal Palace. He has already impressed in his opening games with his pace and energy.

Junior Savane 21 years old

Debut: March 24

Played an important part in the late season run in having joined in March from Holmesdale. Comfortable in the back line he was also a threat going forward and on the overlap. He will be laying claim to a regular place in the starting lineup.

Marcel Elva-Fontaine 23 years old

Debut: August 24

Joined just before the start of the season having previously played for the likes of Lewes on loan whilst being at Aldershot Town. An attacking full back he has made an immediate impression in the back line.

Adam Ahmed 19 years old

Debut: October 23

Previously at Aldershot Town, he joined following the arrival of the Manager last October. Last season he made a total of 13 appearances. This season he has already put in some excellent performances to stake a claim as a defensive regular.

Daryl Siaw 30 years old

Debut: August 23

He was a colossus in the centre half position having spent time in midfield in the earlier part of the campaign. His authority, calmness and leadership on the field made him a pivotal member of the team. The Play Off Final victory was his second successive success and third promotion in three seasons having previously played at Walton & Hersham.

Michael Kamara 35 years old

Debut: August 23

Player/Coach he provided important cover for the team throughout the season bringing his experience and ability to the team just when it was needed. Can count Carshalton Athletic and Merstham amongst his previous clubs.

Michael Phillips 27 years old**Debut: August 23**

Made an immediate impact when he scored on his debut against Horley Town in the FA Cup last season, a game that was shown live on the Red Button. An influential player who has had plenty of success, not just being a key part of Croydon's play-off success last season but also enjoying back-to-back National League Trophy successes with Wealdstone and Maidstone United in recent years.

Cian McCarthy 21 years old**Debut: August 23**

Made a huge contribution to our successful season and on a personal level lifted the Supporters' Player of the Year award. Necessity meant that he moved back from his more familiar midfield role into centre half he made the position his own.

MIDFIELD**Nya Kirby 24 years old****Debut: August 2024**

Spent last season playing for Oxford City in the National League before joining the Rams just before the start of the season. A cultured midfielder, he represented England at youth level including being part of England's victorious Under 17 World Cup winners. He made an appearance for Crystal Palace in the Carabao Cup in 2020 as well as loan spells at Blackpool and Tranmere.

Gus Sow 29 years old**Debut: August 2024**

Arriving during the closed season he played for Leatherhead last season where he played 44 times including the Play-Off Final where they just fell short at the final hurdle. Born in Liberia, he appeared for England U16s whilst at the Crystal Palace Academy.

Mekhi Savage 17 years old**Debut: August 24**

Joined from Epsom & Ewell having been with AFC Whyteleafe previously. Made his debut from the bench and has also scored his first goal for the club.

Alpha Diallo 22 years old**Debut: August 2024**

Another arrival from Leatherhead who made 38 appearances last season helping them to the playoff final. Born in Spain, he played for Dulwich Hamlet and Merstham before arriving at Leatherhead. He joins us to bolster the midfield and bring Step 4 experience despite his young age.

FORWARDS

Tom Collins 31 years old

Debut: March 24

A deadline day signing, he added strength and guile to the front line as well as scoring some important goals. The pick of the bunch being the opener in Jersey to give the team the perfect start. His experience and goalscoring has made him an instant hit with the supporters.

Richard Pingling 25 years old

Debut: March 24

Another end of season signing who had an immediate impact as he managed to reach double figures despite only playing 13 games. He scored the winning goal at Jersey Bulls to set up the Playoff Final and was a constant threat to defences. He is already a fans favourite.

Kadell Daniel 30 years old

Debut: August 2024 - International Debut: 2017 22 caps, 3 goals for Guyana

Joining from Margate he brings a wealth of experience having started his career at Crystal Palace. A Guyana International, he made his debut in 2017 in a game against Cuba. His last appearance being this summer in a game against Belize that ended in a 3-1 win.

Brandon Pierrick 22 years old

Debut: August 2023

Club Captain who is as influential off the field as he is on. His 21 goals from 48 appearances played a key role in promotion. He has committed for this season and has already reached his half a century of appearances. He terrorises defences with his strength, pace and control and has an excellent finish.



History of AFC Croydon Athletic

AFC Croydon Athletic was officially born on 6th February 2012 after a group of supporters gathered at Selhurst Evangelical Church in South Norwood to form a new club. The newly appointed committee had just 7 weeks to put everything in place to convince the Football Association and the League that they were worthy of a place at Step 6 in the pyramid. Despite the challenge it was a successful journey. The need to form a new club had come about because of the demise of Croydon Athletic FC who had folded playing its last game in December 2011.

A successful first season in Division One of the Combined Counties League saw a creditable 8th position. The club also won its first piece of silverware by winning the Lemon Recordings Division One cup by beating Staines Lammas 5-0 at Windsor.

The Club returned to its Spiritual home of Mayfield Stadium on 15th November 2014 with a game against Banstead Athletic. The club maintained a promotion chasing position all season and finally clinched 2nd place with a 3-0 victory over Cobham FC. The club also won its 2nd piece of silverware when winning the London Senior Trophy beating Interwood 4-3 after extra time.

With the FA having placed the club in The Southern Counties East Football League following promotion for the 2015/16 season the club then maintained their position in the league by finishing 11th. In the close season manager Antony Williams resigned as Manager and the club replaced him with Kevin Rayner. His first season saw a highest finish so far of 7th .

A move back to the Combined Counties League followed the reorganisation by the FA and two interrupted seasons due to Covid. Rayner remained at the helm throughout but the results were more of a struggle as the team finished in the lower half of the division.

In May 2023 Rayner recruited Lee Roots as his new joint Manager for the forthcoming season. Then in June 2023 it was announced that the Club had agreed to change ownership with a consortium of Danny Young, Wilfried Zaha and Stormzy taking control. The FA and the League gave their consent to that transfer just before the start of this season.

An opening day victory over Sutton Athletic in the FA Cup took place in front of a record 532 spectators. The next round at Horley Town was broadcast live on BBC Red Button and saw another victory. However, this proved to be the highlight and in September, after exiting the FA Cup and a loss to Jersey Bulls it was decided to part company with the management team.

In October Jermaine McGlashan was named Manager and he took charge of his first game away at Jersey Bulls which ended in a 1-0 victory. There followed a steady rise up the table from 17th place ultimately securing a play-off place with a 5-0 victory over Horley Town in the penultimate league game. The Playoffs involved two away fixtures first in Jersey and then at Knaphill winning both games 2-1 to secure promotion to the Isthmian League for the first time. McGlashan left the club by mutual consent in September 2024 and Michael Kamara is in temporary charge of the team.
