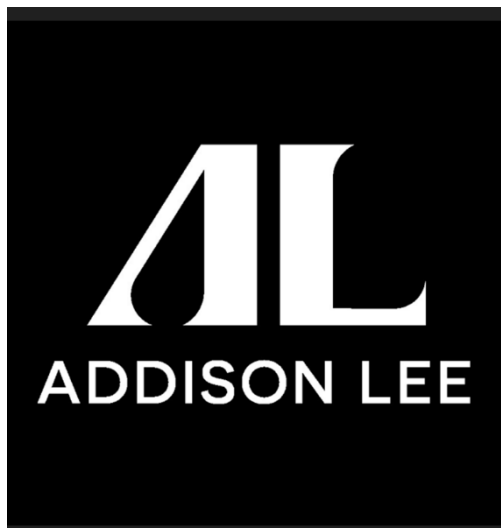
Upon completion of the current redevelopment works at Honeycroft, Langley FC will be playing their home fixtures at Horton Road.

SEVERAL years ago, whilst living in Oxford, I invited a couple of friends to watch the mighty U's in action.

Chris Wilder was in charge at the time and promotion to the Football League was finally on the horizon. James Constable was scoring for fun.

I'd hoped to show them that Non-League football wasn't the sporting wasteland of popular portrayal. That for the princely sum of £20 (twenty quid!) a ticket, they would be handsomely entertained by inventive football and skilful players.

It backfired. Oxford's opponents that day were Kettering, who even by the standards of the day were a brutally direct outfit. The ball spent more time in orbit than the International Space Station and the game was - to this day - one of the worst I've ever paid to watch.

Needless to say, neither of my guests were in a desperate hurry to ditch their season tickets at Newcastle.

Truth be told, though, that *was* a true reflection of Non-League football back then. For every Oxford, there were ten or 20 Kettering Towns, with a hefty unit up top, a couple of headcases at full-back and a midfield that spent the 90 minutes making tackles or watching the ball sail overhead.

And why wouldn't that be the case? Attitudes remained old school. Players still enjoyed a beer, or ten. English clubs weren't yet producing the abundance of talent available today and with only a couple of nights to train every week, it was unrealistic to expect anything else.

Which is why watching Step 3 Horsham go blow for blow with League One Barnsley in the FA Cup last weekend was to be reminded of the incredible progress made by Non-League sides over the last decade.

Whenever an underdog triumphs - and a 3-3 draw at Oakwell was most certainly that - it is tempting to talk about grit and heroism and manning the trenches. To assume that only by outworking and outfighting a preening Goliath can an artisan like David ever hope to prosper. Yet any such suggestion would do Horsham and their manager Dom Di Paola a massive disservice.

Horsham grafted alright. Over the course of the night, they repelled 24 shots. But they never once looked ragged or desperate.

From the first whistle to the last, they adhered to a clear strategy and carried it out with discipline and intelligence.

In transition - a word nobody even used 15 years ago - the Hornets were magnificent, snapping from a back five to a front five with a speed that would have made Pep Guardiola proud. All three of Horsham's goals resulted from rapid overloads on the counter.

What this tactic demonstrated was that Di Paola had analysed Barnsley and recognised that their high defensive line was vulnerable to quick breaks and balls in behind.

It also showed that Horsham's part-time players were smart enough and fit enough to carry out a gameplan that, even for elite professional sides, is physically and mentally demanding.

Frankly, this sort of precision and planning would hardly have happened in the National Premier a decade ago, let alone at Step 3 - and it cuts to the heart of why Non-League football has improved so rapidly.

Back in 2011, AFC Wimbledon keeper Seb Brown was hailed as a visionary for using YouTube to research the preferences of Luton's penalty takers prior to his match-winning performance in the play-off final shoot-out.

Brown did that off his own back, He had to - only the very biggest clubs could afford access to meaningful data in those days, meaning someone like Di Paola couldn't have hoped to study Barnsley without actually visiting Oakwell.

Today, nobody needs YouTube. Clubs far below Horsham's level have access to GPS, scouting and analytics, and enough data to forensically examine the prevalence of back passes in Timbuktu. Players, in turn, don't require physical training time to understand a gameplan. They can view clips online, analyse their own performance or understand how an opponent plays.

Tactical intelligence is no longer the preserve of full-time pros, and nor are professional standards.

Non-League football may still be about having a post-match beer with punters in the clubhouse - and long may that continue - but the vast majority of semi-pro players (many of whom have come through the academy system) now live the lifestyle of an elite athlete.

These improvements - combined with an influx of overseas players at the highest level forcing domestic talent downwards - have changed Non-League football beyond all recognition, and the preponderance of upsets in this year's FA Cup only reinforces the point.

My old mates have had their fingers burned. But anyone introduced to the Non-League game by Horsham last weekend could not fail to be converted.

JOSH ANDREW – DEFENDER

A commanding centre-back Luke is in his second season at Honeycroft, having joined from Windsor FC. A full international for Anguilla where he has played in World Cup Qualification.

LEWIS PEGG - DEFENDER

Joined the club in October 2023 from Beaconsfield Town. Strong central defender who has previously played for Slough Town, Binfield and Bedfont Sports.

SHAUN PREDDIE – DEFENDER

Former Harrow Borough Captain who made over 300 appearances for the Earlsmead Club. His experience will be vital at the heart of The Reds defence.

ELIJAH ANTHONY - DEFENDER

Former Queens Park Rangers Under 21 defender who joined the club from Beaconsfield Town. Attacking full-back with plenty of pace.

LEWIS PATRICK – DEFENDER

In his second season with Uxbridge having joined in the summer of 2022 from Risborough Rangers. A pacey full back who likes to get forward and support the attack. Young Player of the Year winner 2022/23.

SEAN MCGUINNESS – DEFENDER

Young defender who joined from Chalfont St Peter in February 2023. Tall and elegant player who looks to have a bright future.

RYAN HAUGH – DEFENDER

Equally at home at full back or in the centre of defence. Joined Uxbridge from Harrow Borough in 2019 but missed most of last season through injury.

BRYAN TAYLOR – DEFENDER

Left-sided defender who can deliver telling crosses. Signed for the club this summer from Chertsey Town.

MICHAEL BRYAN – MIDFIELD

Vastly experienced midfielder who was previously with Harrow Borough. Made 14 appearances for Watford in the Championship and earned two full International Caps for Northern Ireland in 2010. Will add guile and skill to the middle of the park.

KENSLEY MALONEY - MIDFIELD

All action midfielder who links the play from defence to attack. In his second season with The Reds having joined from Walton Casuals.

GEORGE MOORE - MIDFIELD

Attacking midfielder with an eye for goal. Joined the club in October 2023 giving spent the previous five seasons at Harrow Borough where he scored 70 goals in 230 appearances.

ALAN HEDLEY – DEFENDER/MIDFIELD

Made his 100th appearance for The Reds last season having joined from Chalfont St Peter in 2019. Mr consistent, he was named Supporters Player of the Year last season.

PRINCE OGUNMEKAN - MIDFIELD

Rejoined The Reds this season following a year away studying. Voted Player Of The Year in 2021-22, he brings tenacity and guile to the centre of midfield.

LEWIS COLE – MIDFIELD

Lewis began his career at Uxbridge, making his first team debut at just 19 years of age in 2014. Left Honeycroft in 2017 to join Harrow Borough. Had brief spells at Chertsey Town and Hanwell Town last season.

ALEX WITHAM – MIDFIELD/FORWARD

Uxbridge's top scorer last season, which saw him pick up the Player of the Year award. Good in the air and with his feet his versatility makes him a managers dream. Former Arsenal Youth, who played alongside Jack Wilshire for the Gunners.

EZRA NDUKUBA – MIDFIELD/FORWARD

Attacking midfielder with quick feet. Has an eye for goal and the Club are delighted to have him back after he missed the whole of last season with a serious injury.

DEAN MORGAN - FORWARD

Came to Honeycroft this season after a long career in the Football League. Previous Clubs include Colchester United, Reading, Luton Town, MK Dons, Leyton Orient, Chesterfield and Wycombe Wanderers. Will be a real asset to The Reds forward line this season.

BRAD PAGLIAROLI – MIDFIELD/FORWARD

New signing this season having been part of the successful Binfield side last term. Wide player who gets his fair share of goals with his direct play. Has also represented Thatcham Town.

ALEX PAINE - MIDFIELD

Alex is in his second spell with the club having played for Chertsey Town last season. Former Chalfont St Peter midfielder who never gives less than 100%.

BERNARD MENSAH – FORWARD

Previous Clubs include Watford, where he was part of their Youth set-up, Aldershot Town, Bristol Rovers, Gloucester City and Redditch United. A talented striker who joined the Club this season.



UXBRIDGE FOOTBALL CLUB - HISTORY

In the late 19th century the game of "football" was growing in popularity and on the 3rd February 1871 a group of eminent local businessmen held the inaugural meeting of Uxbridge Football Club. A local solicitor, Mr William Gardiner, was elected as the Club's President and the club's colours were chosen as white shirts with a light blue Maltese cross and a light blue velvet cap with silver tassel. Friendly games against local opposition were played in the early years, until the FA Cup was entered in 1873. A First Round Victory over Gitanos set-up a Second-Round tie against eventual finalists Royal Engineers, which the Engineers narrowly won 2-1. It was at this time that Uxbridge could boast amongst its ranks a Full England International. Hubert Heron played for England on two occasions whilst an Uxbridge player before he moved to Wanderers FC where he gained further international honours. His brother Francis, formerly of Uxbridge, also played for England after joining him at Wanderers FC.

The club changed its colours to Oxford Blue and Cambridge Blue shirts in 1874 but they were in financial difficulties and folded later that year. The main problem for Uxbridge was the lack of a permanent home ground (a problem that was to plague them until the middle of the next century), the committee searched the town for a suitable base but were thwarted at every turn and they led a nomadic existence, moving ground every few years. The enthusiasm for a team in Uxbridge was still prevalent and the Club was reformed in 1879. In 1886 Uxbridge FC amalgamated with another local club, Uxbridge Crescents, and played under this name in season 1886/87, before reverting to plain old Uxbridge the following season. It was at this time that the Red Shirts, which are still worn today, were adopted and the nickname "The Reds" was born.

Their first trophy was won in 1889 when they lifted the West Middlesex Cup, defeating Colnbrook 1-0 in the Final. The end of the 19th century was a particularly successful period for The Reds as they won the West Middlesex Cup on three further occasions and also won the prestigious Middlesex Senior Cup twice. In 1894 they beat the 3rd Grenadier Guards 2-0 and repeated that success two years later with a 3-2 victory over local rivals Southall in a replay in front of over 5000 spectators. The outstanding achievement however was in reaching the final of the F.A. Amateur Cup in 1898. This was the club's first season in the competition and they had to win eight ties before meeting Middlesborough in the final at Crystal Palace.

Unfortunately, their North East rivals proved too strong for them on the day and ran out 2-0 winners. During this successful period for the club they became founder members of Division Two of the Southern League in 1894, finishing fourth in their first four seasons. However, in season 1898/99 they finished next to bottom and the dwindling crowds (averaging around 500) meant that financially the club was once again in trouble. A decision was therefore taken to withdraw from the Southern League and join the local Middlesex League to try and stabilise the club. However, a majority of the more talented players joined other clubs and they struggled in their new surroundings, finishing bottom with only one point from their 14 games. At the end of the season the club had a deficit of £130 and with few players the club once again folded.

For two years much fund raising amongst the local community finally saw the club's debts paid and the reformed Uxbridge FC joined the West Middlesex League for the 1902/03 season. In 1904 the Great Western Suburban League was entered and here they stayed until the outbreak of the First World War.

Their best finish during this period was as Runners-up to Brentford Reserves in 1910/11. They also won the Middlesex Charity Cup on two occasions in 1908 and 1913, as they looked to re-establish themselves as a force in the football world. Following the end of hostilities Uxbridge joined the Athenian League and added "Town" to their name.

An unsuccessful first Athenian League campaign saw them relegated back to the Great Western Suburban League in 1920. A successful four seasons saw them back in the Athenian League in 1924 where they remained until 1937. The Middlesex Charity Cup was won for the third time in 1935 as Finchley were beaten 4-3. Two poor seasons saw them finish bottom of the Athenian League in 1936 and 1937 and the club failed to be re-elected. They joined the Spartan League for the 1937/38 season, dropping "Town" from their name at the end of the campaign stood proudly at the summit.

Championship celebrations however were cut short when it was discovered that The Reds had played an ineligible player and were deduced six points, placing them in third position behind Champions Marlow. Following the debacle of their one and only season in the Spartan League they resigned and joined the London League prior to the Second World War.

During the war years they continued to play and joined the newly formed Great Western Combination League before re-joining the London League in 1945, finishing as Runners-up to Edgware Town. Uxbridge were founder members of the Corinthian League in 1946 and remained in this league for the next seventeen years. Finally, in 1948, after over three quarters of a century of searching, a ground of their own was purchased. A piece of land in Cleveland Road, Cowley was bought for £5,800 by then President Mr W.S. Try.

The ground was named after a large house that stood on the land and "Honeycroft" was the new home of Uxbridge Football Club. During this period, they won their only Championship to-date when they were crowned Corinthian League Champions at the end of the 1959/60 season. They also won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the third time in 1951 when they defeated Hayes 2-1.

This was a successful period in the club's history as they finished in the top five of the Corinthian League on no less than eight occasions and crowds were averaging around the thousand mark. A re-organisation of Non-League football saw the end of the Corinthian League in 1963 and club found itself once again in Division One of the Athenian League. This was a lean time for The Reds, they were relegated to Division Two in 1967 and financial problems once again beset them. They gained national publicity in 1976 when England were looking for a side to play as part of their warm-up for the forthcoming World Cup campaign. Uxbridge took on a full-strength England at Wembley, losing 8-0.

The ground problems that had blighted Uxbridge throughout their history surfaced once again and the club had to find a new home. In 1978 they moved to their current headquarters in Horton Road, Yiewsley. A former works Sports & Social Club they have developed the site to the superb standard you see today.

Over the past 43 years they have added floodlights (opened by the visit of Arsenal in 1981), new stands, fencing and in more recent times a new clubhouse was opened and car park laid. On the playing front the club won the Middlesex Charity Cup for the fourth time in 1982, their first silverware for 31 years, and moved to the Isthmian League in the same year, winning promotion to Division One in 1985.

The Final of the AC Delco Cup (League Cup) was reached in 1986, where they met Premier Division Champions Sutton United. The Reds failed to stop Sutton completing "The Double" though, losing 3-1 in the Final in front of over a thousand spectators at Imber Court, the home of Metropolitan Police FC, Uxbridge entered the London Challenge Cup for the first time in the 1992/93 season and hence followed a love affair between the Reds and the magnificent trophy. In the eight seasons they entered the competition they reached five finals, winning on three occasions in 1994, 1997 and 2000.

They won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the fourth time in 2001, defeating Harrow Borough 3-0 in the Final held at Honeycroft. In 2004 the club were moved across the pyramid to the Southern League and have reached the Play-Offs on three occasions. In 2004/05 they lost on penalties, after leading Maldon Town in extra-time, in 2007/08 they narrowly lost 0-1 at Oxford City and in 2011/12 they lost 2-1 at Bedworth United in the Semi-Finals. In 2018 Uxbridge were moved back across the pyramid, re-joining the Isthmian League in the South Central Division.

They have won the Middlesex Charity Cup on three more occasions in the last eight years. Defeating Brentford in 2013, Wembley in 2014 and Ashford Town (Middlesex) at Hanwell Town FC in 2019.

In the summer of 2016, the Club lost one of its stalwarts when long serving President Alan Odell passed away. Alan had been associated with The Reds for over 80 years, firstly as a supporter and player in his youth, before serving in various official duties as a committee member. He is sadly missed.

In 2019 Uxbridge appointed only their sixth manager over the past 51 years. Ron Clack was in charge for 18-years from 1970, followed by Peter Marshall for one season, Michael Harvey for three, before George Talbot took the reins for fourteen seasons in 1992. In 2006 Tony Choules became the man in charge, being replaced by our current manager Danny Edwards in 2019.

Danny is a UEFA A licensed coach who spent 15 years as manager of Chalfont St Peter AFC. He steered Chalfont St Peter to Step 4 of the league system in 2011, as well as reaching the 3rd Qualifying Round of the Football Association Challenge Cup on three occasions. Danny has with him a confident team which includes Fred Cummings as his Assistant Manager. Fred is well known to the followers of the Red Army as a combative centre half with 320 First Team appearances for Uxbridge in the 1980's.

The Middlesex Charity Cup was won for the 8th time in 2022, with a 2-0 victory over Hanwell Town. Last season the club had a fantastic run in the FA Trophy, reaching the 3rd Round where they lost to National League side Dagenham & Redbridge

Harry Cawdron (Goalkeeper) SPONSORED BY: - The Cawdron Family

One of our new recruits, Harry joined The Baggies in the summer from Camberley Town whilst being dual registered with Walton & Hersham. The 20-year-old from Dorking was previously with Leatherhead and a former product from the Crystal Palace FC Academy.

Kane Fitzgerald (Midfielder) SPONSORED BY: - Badshot Lea U10's Cobras

Rejoined Badshot Lea in 2022 after a short spell at neighbours Farnham Town. Previously swooped all the awards in the 2021/22 season at Badshot Lea before moving to 'the dark side!'. Kane is club captain here for a reason, a lovely player on & off the pitch, previous clubs include Ashford Town Bracknell Town and Binfield. The club were delighted to re-sign him for last season's promotion.

Kai Allsopp (Midfielder) SPONSORED BY:-

Kai joins Badshot Lea on loan from Slough Town and made his debut as a substitute in the FA Trophy game versus Thame United. The midfielder previously spent a month at Ascot United and was part of the side who beat The Baggies back in August. His former clubs include Reading FC Academy and Beaconsfield Town.

Twenty years of age Reece, who lives in Feltham, had previous spells with Hemel Hempstead FC and Berkhamstead.

Tane Caubo (Forward) SPONSORED BY: -

An important player to be retained from last seasons promotion squad, Tane is pacy and never runs out of gas. Originally came to us a couple of campaigns ago on loan from Met Police FC, Tane rejoined after a brief spell at Balham back in September last year.

Lamin Ceesay (Winger) SPONSORED BY: -

Following a season at Farnham Town where he was almost ever present, after a pre-season with Town in the summer decided he wanted to show what he is all about by stepping up to Step 4 moving across the borough to Badshot Lea. A thorn in the Baggies side last term scoring against us, Lamin will be a valuable member of his new team.

James Beauchamp (Forward) SPONSORED BY: -

Another exciting signing who had been on the radar of many Step 4 clubs in the summer, James joins us from Binfield FC. A popular player at his previous club, James also enjoyed a spell at Fleet Town where he excelled. A local boy who lives in Aldershot he is currently sidelined with injury.

Steven Sylla (Forward) SPONSORED BY: -

22-year-old Steven can play as a centre forward or on the right wing. Born in Middlesbrough, Sylla moved to the South of France and played for French 2nd division side Grenoble in their academy setup. He moved back to England and settled in Kennington South London and joins Badshot Lea after playing for fellow Step 4 side Southall FC.

Nasim Regragui (Forward) SPONSORED BY :-

Signing in mid-August, Nasim comes to Badshot Lea after playing for two seasons in the Swedish 2nd Division. Previously to that, the 21-year-old had a spell playing in Morocco before settling at Waltham Abbey FC in the Southern League Central Division. Nasim currently resides in Chertsey, Surrey.

BADSHOT LEA FC CLUB HIJSTORY

Wrecclesham, Surrey based Badshot Lea are managed by the duo of Gavin Smith and Dave Ford, assisted by Daniel Bailey and Lee Dyson. With a stronger squad and a focus on developing young players, there is renewed optimism for the 2022/23 season as the Baggies look to build on last season's 5th place finish.

Early history suggests that the village football club was formed in 1904 after a meeting at the local village hall. The team affiliated to the Surrey County Football Association in 1907.

The club progressed through the three divisions of the Surrey Intermediate League, promoting to the Surrey Premier League in 1986.

1997 marked the year that the first youth team joined the football club. This marked the beginning of a very successful Youth and Colts section of the club. The club were given an extra facility to accommodate the growth success of the youth teams.

Dave Ford took over at the helm as manager with Nathan Fealey in 2004. In their first season they took the side to a credible 7th place finish in senior football, as members of the Hellenic League.

Lea finished the season around mid table and reached two cup finals, only narrowly losing out to Sandhurst Town in the Aldershot Senior Cup on penalties in 2006.

Badshot Lea secured a ground sharing agreement with nearby club Farnborough a year later. Under the guise of Dave Ford's management, Badshot finished their first season at step 5 in a respectable 11th position. The National League Committee sanctioned a move to the Combined Counties League in 2008.

Following this, the Surrey club reached the 2nd qualifying round of the FA Cup and the 3rd round proper of the FA Vase. A year later Baggy Lea lifted the Aldershot Senior Cup, defeating Fleet Town on penalties.

Manager Dave Ford departed the club and was replaced by Mark Anderson. Anderson led the team to an excellent league finish, as well as progressing through to the FA Cup 3rd qualifying round.

In December 2018 Gav Smith took up the managerial hot seat jointly alongside Dave Ford at Westfield Lane. Badshot Lea finished the 2021/22 campaign towards the top of the table in 5th place, recording 24 wins from 38 league games; recording only one away defeat all season.
