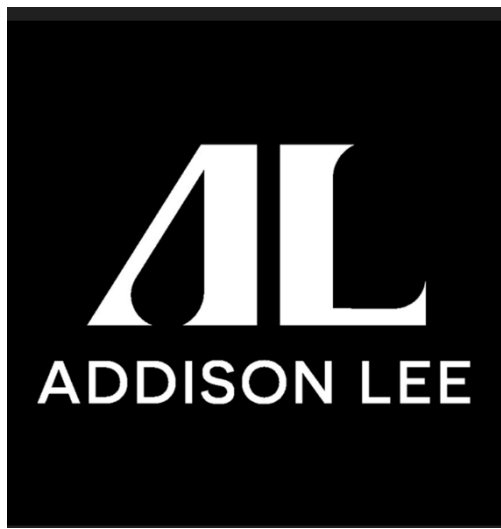
Upon completion of the current redevelopment works at Honeycroft, Langley FC will be playing their home fixtures at Horton Road.

WHEN The Football Association dropped the bombshell midway through last week that Barnsley were being booted out of the FA Cup for fielding an ineligible player, it may have made more people realise just what goes into running a football club.

We all turn up on a Saturday or midweek to watch a game but it's unlikely we ever think about the work that goes in away from the match day to make sure everything runs smoothly.

Every season we see a Non-League club fall foul of rules in cup competitions. Whether it's a player not registered properly, someone who is cup tied or even under suspension, there are many pitfalls to dodge.

On The Non-League Show podcast with Tim Fuell we've often talked about the pressures on volunteers of clubs and have come to the conclusion: Who would be a Non-League secretary?!

While having every sympathy for Barnsley fans, the news also brought a feeling that these things don't just happen to Non-League clubs and the full-time professional outfits can make mistakes too. Ultimately, that's what this is. Barnsley almost certainly weren't trying to gain any advantage over Horsham on the sly, they just made the error of playing a player in their replay who was out on loan when the original tie — a thrilling 3-3 draw — was played.

But the League One side's bad luck was Horsham's gain and this weekend they take on Sutton United.

It's funny how it's worked out for Dom Di Paola's side. The Isthmian Premier club were, understandably, aggrieved when they had to play their first game up at Barnsley on a Friday night under instruction from South Yorkshire Police.

As a result, a number of fans couldn't make it — even though the Lardy Army did travel in their droves and lapped up every minute of the six-goal thriller.

The draw meant back it was to Sussex in front of the live TV cameras with the benefits of a live TV fee and now this reinstatement for a chance to take on League Two Sutton.

Whether you believe in fate or not, the Hornets will no doubt be in south west London this Saturday full of belief and hope. Maybe it's meant to be!

SHAUN PREDDIE – DEFENDER

MICHAEL BRYAN – MIDFIELD

Vastly experienced midfielder who was previously with Harrow Borough. Made 14 appearances for Watford in the Championship and earned two full International Caps for Northern Ireland in 2010. Will add guile and skill to the middle of the park.

KENSLEY MALONEY - MIDFIELD

All action midfielder who links the play from defence to attack. In his second season with The Reds having joined from Walton Casuals.

GEORGE MOORE - MIDFIELD

Attacking midfielder with an eye for goal. Joined the club in October 2023 giving spent the previous five seasons at Harrow Borough where he scored 70 goals in 230 appearances.

ALAN HEDLEY – DEFENDER/MIDFIELD

Made his 100th appearance for The Reds last season having joined from Chalfont St Peter in 2019. Mr consistent, he was named Supporters Player of the Year last season.

PRINCE OGUNMEKAN - MIDFIELD

Rejoined The Reds this season following a year away studying. Voted Player Of The Year in 2021-22, he brings tenacity and guile to the centre of midfield.

LEWIS COLE – MIDFIELD

Lewis began his career at Uxbridge, making his first team debut at just 19 years of age in 2014. Left Honeycroft in 2017 to join Harrow Borough. Had brief spells at Chertsey Town and Hanwell Town last season.

ALEX WITHAM – MIDFIELD/FORWARD

Uxbridge's top scorer last season, which saw him pick up the Player of the Year award. Good in the air and with his feet his versatility makes him a managers dream. Former Arsenal Youth, who played alongside Jack Wilshire for the Gunners.

EZRA NDUKUBA – MIDFIELD/FORWARD

Attacking midfielder with quick feet. Has an eye for goal and the Club are delighted to have him back after he missed the whole of last season with a serious injury.

DEAN MORGAN - FORWARD

Came to Honeycroft this season after a long career in the Football League. Previous Clubs include Colchester United, Reading, Luton Town, MK Dons, Leyton Orient, Chesterfield and Wycombe Wanderers. Will be a real asset to The Reds forward line this season.

BRAD PAGLIAROLI – MIDFIELD/FORWARD

New signing this season having been part of the successful Binfield side last term. Wide player who gets his fair share of goals with his direct play. Has also represented Thatcham Town.

ALEX PAINE - MIDFIELD

Alex is in his second spell with the club having played for Chertsey Town last season. Former Chalfont St Peter midfielder who never gives less than 100%.

BERNARD MENSAH – FORWARD

Previous Clubs include Watford, where he was part of their Youth set-up, Aldershot Town, Bristol Rovers, Gloucester City and Redditch United. A talented striker who joined the Club this season.



UXBRIDGE FOOTBALL CLUB - HISTORY

In the late 19th century the game of "football" was growing in popularity and on the 3rd February 1871 a group of eminent local businessmen held the inaugural meeting of Uxbridge Football Club. A local solicitor, Mr William Gardiner, was elected as the Club's President and the club's colours were chosen as white shirts with a light blue Maltese cross and a light blue velvet cap with silver tassel. Friendly games against local opposition were played in the early years, until the FA Cup was entered in 1873. A First Round Victory over Gitanos set-up a Second-Round tie against eventual finalists Royal Engineers, which the Engineers narrowly won 2-1. It was at this time that Uxbridge could boast amongst its ranks a Full England International. Hubert Heron played for England on two occasions whilst an Uxbridge player before he moved to Wanderers FC where he gained further international honours. His brother Francis, formerly of Uxbridge, also played for England after joining him at Wanderers FC.

The club changed its colours to Oxford Blue and Cambridge Blue shirts in 1874 but they were in financial difficulties and folded later that year. The main problem for Uxbridge was the lack of a permanent home ground (a problem that was to plague them until the middle of the next century), the committee searched the town for a suitable base but were thwarted at every turn and they led a nomadic existence, moving ground every few years. The enthusiasm for a team in Uxbridge was still prevalent and the Club was reformed in 1879. In 1886 Uxbridge FC amalgamated with another local club, Uxbridge Crescents, and played under this name in season 1886/87, before reverting to plain old Uxbridge the following season. It was at this time that the Red Shirts, which are still worn today, were adopted and the nickname "The Reds" was born.

Their first trophy was won in 1889 when they lifted the West Middlesex Cup, defeating Colnbrook 1-0 in the Final. The end of the 19th century was a particularly successful period for The Reds as they won the West Middlesex Cup on three further occasions and also won the prestigious Middlesex Senior Cup twice. In 1894 they beat the 3rd Grenadier Guards 2-0 and repeated that success two years later with a 3-2 victory over local rivals Southall in a replay in front of over 5000 spectators. The outstanding achievement however was in reaching the final of the F.A. Amateur Cup in 1898. This was the club's first season in the competition and they had to win eight ties before meeting Middlesborough in the final at Crystal Palace.

Unfortunately, their North East rivals proved too strong for them on the day and ran out 2-0 winners. During this successful period for the club they became founder members of Division Two of the Southern League in 1894, finishing fourth in their first four seasons. However, in season 1898/99 they finished next to bottom and the dwindling crowds (averaging around 500) meant that financially the club was once again in trouble. A decision was therefore taken to withdraw from the Southern League and join the local Middlesex League to try and stabilise the club. However, a majority of the more talented players joined other clubs and they struggled in their new surroundings, finishing bottom with only one point from their 14 games. At the end of the season the club had a deficit of £130 and with few players the club once again folded.

For two years much fund raising amongst the local community finally saw the club's debts paid and the reformed Uxbridge FC joined the West Middlesex League for the 1902/03 season. In 1904 the Great Western Suburban League was entered and here they stayed until the outbreak of the First World War.

Their best finish during this period was as Runners-up to Brentford Reserves in 1910/11. They also won the Middlesex Charity Cup on two occasions in 1908 and 1913, as they looked to re-establish themselves as a force in the football world. Following the end of hostilities Uxbridge joined the Athenian League and added "Town" to their name.

An unsuccessful first Athenian League campaign saw them relegated back to the Great Western Suburban League in 1920. A successful four seasons saw them back in the Athenian League in 1924 where they remained until 1937. The Middlesex Charity Cup was won for the third time in 1935 as Finchley were beaten 4-3. Two poor seasons saw them finish bottom of the Athenian League in 1936 and 1937 and the club failed to be re-elected. They joined the Spartan League for the 1937/38 season, dropping "Town" from their name at the end of the campaign stood proudly at the summit.

Championship celebrations however were cut short when it was discovered that The Reds had played an ineligible player and were deduced six points, placing them in third position behind Champions Marlow. Following the debacle of their one and only season in the Spartan League they resigned and joined the London League prior to the Second World War.

During the war years they continued to play and joined the newly formed Great Western Combination League before re-joining the London League in 1945, finishing as Runners-up to Edgware Town. Uxbridge were founder members of the Corinthian League in 1946 and remained in this league for the next seventeen years. Finally, in 1948, after over three quarters of a century of searching, a ground of their own was purchased. A piece of land in Cleveland Road, Cowley was bought for £5,800 by then President Mr W.S. Try.

The ground was named after a large house that stood on the land and "Honeycroft" was the new home of Uxbridge Football Club. During this period, they won their only Championship to-date when they were crowned Corinthian League Champions at the end of the 1959/60 season. They also won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the third time in 1951 when they defeated Hayes 2-1.

This was a successful period in the club's history as they finished in the top five of the Corinthian League on no less than eight occasions and crowds were averaging around the thousand mark. A re-organisation of Non-League football saw the end of the Corinthian League in 1963 and club found itself once again in Division One of the Athenian League. This was a lean time for The Reds, they were relegated to Division Two in 1967 and financial problems once again beset them. They gained national publicity in 1976 when England were looking for a side to play as part of their warm-up for the forthcoming World Cup campaign. Uxbridge took on a full-strength England at Wembley, losing 8-0.

The ground problems that had blighted Uxbridge throughout their history surfaced once again and the club had to find a new home. In 1978 they moved to their current headquarters in Horton Road, Yiewsley. A former works Sports & Social Club they have developed the site to the superb standard you see today.

Over the past 43 years they have added floodlights (opened by the visit of Arsenal in 1981), new stands, fencing and in more recent times a new clubhouse was opened and car park laid. On the playing front the club won the Middlesex Charity Cup for the fourth time in 1982, their first silverware for 31 years, and moved to the Isthmian League in the same year, winning promotion to Division One in 1985.

The Final of the AC Delco Cup (League Cup) was reached in 1986, where they met Premier Division Champions Sutton United. The Reds failed to stop Sutton completing "The Double" though, losing 3-1 in the Final in front of over a thousand spectators at Imber Court, the home of Metropolitan Police FC, Uxbridge entered the London Challenge Cup for the first time in the 1992/93 season and hence followed a love affair between the Reds and the magnificent trophy. In the eight seasons they entered the competition they reached five finals, winning on three occasions in 1994, 1997 and 2000.

They won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the fourth time in 2001, defeating Harrow Borough 3-0 in the Final held at Honeycroft. In 2004 the club were moved across the pyramid to the Southern League and have reached the Play-Offs on three occasions. In 2004/05 they lost on penalties, after leading Maldon Town in extra-time, in 2007/08 they narrowly lost 0-1 at Oxford City and in 2011/12 they lost 2-1 at Bedworth United in the Semi-Finals. In 2018 Uxbridge were moved back across the pyramid, re-joining the Isthmian League in the South Central Division.

They have won the Middlesex Charity Cup on three more occasions in the last eight years. Defeating Brentford in 2013, Wembley in 2014 and Ashford Town (Middlesex) at Hanwell Town FC in 2019.

In the summer of 2016, the Club lost one of its stalwarts when long serving President Alan Odell passed away. Alan had been associated with The Reds for over 80 years, firstly as a supporter and player in his youth, before serving in various official duties as a committee member. He is sadly missed.

In 2019 Uxbridge appointed only their sixth manager over the past 51 years. Ron Clack was in charge for 18-years from 1970, followed by Peter Marshall for one season, Michael Harvey for three, before George Talbot took the reins for fourteen seasons in 1992. In 2006 Tony Choules became the man in charge, being replaced by our current manager Danny Edwards in 2019.

Danny is a UEFA A licensed coach who spent 15 years as manager of Chalfont St Peter AFC. He steered Chalfont St Peter to Step 4 of the league system in 2011, as well as reaching the 3rd Qualifying Round of the Football Association Challenge Cup on three occasions. Danny has with him a confident team which includes Fred Cummings as his Assistant Manager. Fred is well known to the followers of the Red Army as a combative centre half with 320 First Team appearances for Uxbridge in the 1980's.

The Middlesex Charity Cup was won for the 8th time in 2022, with a 2-0 victory over Hanwell Town. Last season the club had a fantastic run in the FA Trophy, reaching the 3rd Round where they lost to National League side Dagenham & Redbridge

Jordan Olds – aged 19 – signed from Bromley, & made his debut in the home tie v. Peacehaven & Telscombe in the FA Cup

Zohair Ali – aged 19 – promising young full-back or centre-half, captain of Chipstead's under-18 side in 2021/22 & made his senior debut in the 3-0 win at Ashford Town (Middlesex) in March 2022

Freddie Robins – aged 18 – midfielder who joined in the close season from Leighton Town, & made his debut as sub in the 6-2 home league win over Hartley Wintney

Martin Emmanuel Sontan – aged 23 – speedy midfielder who has recently joined from Hastings Utd., having previously played at Croydon FC & Whyteleafe too - made his debut off the bench in the 1-0 league win at Northwood, & scored in the 4-1 home league win over Guernsey, the winner in the 1-0 home league victory over Ascot Utd. & from the penalty spot in the 3-2 home league defeat to Sutton Common Rovers

Bradley Wilson – aged 26 – club captain & an attacking midfielder, signed from Sevenoaks Town, made his debut in the 4-2 home league defeat by Basingstoke in February 2023, & has scored from open play + the penalty spot since then, including his spot-kick at home to Tooting Bec in pre-season, & in both matches v. Peacehaven & Telscombe in the FA Cup & in open play in the 4-1 home league win over Corinthian-Casuals & from a header in the 4-2 league defeat at Badshot Lea

Nicholas Wilson – aged 23 – midfielder, nicknamed 'Tricky', who joined from Epsom & Ewell in the close season, & made his debut off the bench in the 4-1 home league win over Corinthian-Casuals, but has rejoined Epsom & Ewell for more game time on a dual registration

Forwards

Kobi Asante – aged 18 – captain of the under-18s side in 2022/23, now making the step up to the 1st team – attacking midfielder, with an eye for goal & taker of most of the under-18s' set pieces – came on as sub in the 3-2 league win at Thatcham Town & started in the 3-1 home league defeat to Leatherhead last term

Reuben Ashun – aged 17 – goal-scoring forward with Chipstead's current under-18s, who has earned his call-up to the 1st team squad

Daniel Berry – aged 19 – another product of Chipstead under-18s, a handful up front, who has been playing for Dorking Wanderers under-23s since, & scored three times in pre-season, & in the 6-2 home league win over Hartley Wintney, in the 4-2 league defeat at Badshot Lea & in the 3-2 home league defeat to Sutton Common Rovers

Alfawaz Dada – aged 18 – bustling winger who has shown his pace in pre-season, & joins from Rising Ballers – made his debut as sub in the home FA Cup tie with Peacehaven & Telscombe

Arlie Desanges – aged 29 – prolific scorer with Sutton Athletic in Kent, & already off the mark in pre-season at Three Bridges – scored twice in the 6-2 home league win over Hartley Wintney, the equaliser in the 1-1 league draw at Binfield, two more in the 4-1 home league win over Corinthian-Casuals, the 2nd goal in the 4-2 home defeat to Lancing in the FA Trophy, the 4th goal in the 4-1 home league win over Guernsey, & the 2nd goal in the 2-2 Velocity Cup game at South Park, before notching one of the winning penalties in the shootout

Jacob Sewell – aged 23 – outstanding goal return for Carshalton Athletic's under-18s in season 2018-19, & he featured for the Chipstead 1st team, scoring for them too – now back hopefully injury-free & keen to get scoring again in 2023/24, starting in the 4-1 home league win over Corinthian-Casuals, & scoring the only goal in the 1-0 friendly win at Merstham, the winner in the 1-0 league win at Northwood & the first goal in the 4-1 home league win over Guernsey

Abel Vendrells-Parcerisa – aged 18 – signed from Carshalton Athletic, but was a member of Chipstead under-18s, then Met Police's under-18s, before playing at Redhill too – made his debut in the 1-0 Velocity Cup win at Leatherhead, & scored in the 4-1 home league win over Guernsey + the 1st goal in the 2-2 Velocity Cup game at South Park, before notching one of the winning penalties in the shootout

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CHIPSTEAD FC

Chipstead Football Club was formed in 1906, when the Netherne hospital was being built, and the building workers and the lads in Chipstead challenged each other to a match. The oldest club records dated 1911 show a far from healthy position, survival relying mainly on the proceeds of whist drives. The club's health began to improve, and, in 1920, it even had its own transport for away games, an open topped lorry owned by a local builder. Up until the 1962/63 season, Chipstead played junior football, but, having finished runners-up in the County Junior Cup the previous year, they then moved into the Surrey Intermediate League

The club played at this standard until 1982, when they became founder members of the Surrey Premier League. The next four years saw the club have great success, finishing runners-up three times, and also winning the League Cup on three occasions. During this period, they were also beaten finalists in the County Premier Cup. The reserves also met with success being runners-up once, and also winning the League Cup. After a long battle, the club was awarded senior status in 1986, and was promoted to the Combined Counties League, where once again success followed; a League Championship was gained in 1989/90, and a runners-up spot was gained on two occasions, with six League Cup Final appearances, with Chipstead being victorious in four

Season 1987/88 saw the club make its debut in the FA Vase, and the following year in the FA Cup. Over recent years, the club has continued to grow, and strengthen its youth policy, with some 200 players between the ages of six and eighteen involved every week. Two former Chipstead youth players - Leon McKenzie and Steve Sidwell - moved on to professional clubs, & more recently, Saidou Khan played for our 1st team, & is now with Swindon Town. The Combined Counties championship winning squad contained no fewer than 12 players, who had represented the club at youth level

In 1998 Chipstead was able to purchase the freehold of the ground from the local authority. Thanks to a grant from the FA in 2001, the club was able to purchase additional land, which was developed into mini-soccer pitches to further enhance its youth policy. More recently, in November 2004, a 100-seater stand was installed, which was increased to 150 in March 2007. In May 2006, a covered standing area for 150 people was also erected

2006-07 was the club's 'Centenary' season, and the hope was that it would be a memorable one. On the opening day of the season, the team won their first game, and went top of the table; come February, and still top, the decision was made to do the necessary work to achieve the ground upgrading. The next six weeks saw the ground transformed, thanks to the incredible hard work of the committee and supporters. The team remained top, and promotion to the Ryman League was achieved for the first time in 100 years

In the 2007-08 season Chipstead established themselves in the Ryman League, finishing a creditable 15th. They also went on to win the Southern Combination Cup, beating Ryman Premier side Ashford Town (Middlesex) in the final. In 2008-09 Chipstead struggled in the league, but, in the FA Cup, reached the 4th qualifying round for the first time in their history, eventually losing at Torquay United. 2010-11 saw Chipstead finished 10th being their highest league position ever

2012-13 was a poor season for the club with no fewer than 4 managers - Mark Tompkins left the club after just one game; assistant Mick Read stepped in as temporary manager for a month, before the club appointed John Hamsher. Things seemed fine until January, when results took a dip. John decided to step down in early April, with vice-chairman Mick Ford taking over the reins for the final three matches

In 2013-14 Chipstead started the season with a new management team - Kevin Rayner, with Roly Martin as his assistant, and Mark Elgar as technical assistant. From August until the end of October, 7 games out of 21 were won in all competitions, including losing both FA Trophy & FA Cup matches within eight days. Geoff Corner stepped aside as chairman, with Mick Ford taking up the position. Mick's first task was to appoint a new manager in Steve Baker. A mid-table finish of 13th was a great turnaround for the club. Steve left the club in 2014-15, and was replaced by Simon Colbran

Following a poor start to the 2015/16 season, Simon resigned, and was replaced by Lyndon Buckwell. Unable to turn things around, Lyndon was himself replaced by Craig Tanner, who ultimately managed to save the club from relegation with a few games to spare. Craig then left the club during the summer

2016-17 saw the return of ex-Chipstead player Antony Williams to manage the 1st team along with his assistants, two of whom had played for the club in the past, Rob Kember & Robert Smith. Having former club players in management gave everyone at the club a lift, and they quickly got to work, and comfortably avoided relegation. They laid the foundations for the 2017-18 season, & remain at the same level to this day, although the powers that be put the club in the Bostik League South Central Division for 2018/19

This provided many new clubs in opposition, yet Chipstead held their own in the division, although Antony decided to step aside, as the season drew to a close – his two coaches, Rob Kember & Robert Smith stepped forward to take up the mantle, & led the club into the 2019/20 season in the newly-named BetVictor Isthmian League South Central Division

Following 2 curtailed seasons due to the pandemic, Messrs. Kember and Smith remained in their management role. The club finished 10th in the 2021/22 season, our equally highest ever position in the Isthmian League. They continued to build and strengthen the squad for season 2022/23. The end of 22/23 saw the departure of the management team - Rob Kember, Robert Smith and Allan Tait - after 4 years at the helm

The club was quick to appoint Dean Sammut in his first managerial role, following a brief spell at Burgess Hill in a caretaker role alongside Lewis Taylor. Dean had been a coach for the first team over the past couple of years. He added to his team Lewis Taylor, an experienced player and coach, and Matty Males, a past Chipstead captain. The squad is coming together, and we look forward to the new season, 2023/24
