THEY'RE paid the big bucks because they make the big contributions. Top strikers are worth their weight in gold.

Whether it's turning possession into points when his team is playing well to getting his manager out of jail when they're not, the value of an in-form number nine simply cannot be underestimated.

Take Charnock Richard FC for example. Back in 2009, they took a punt on a young 24-year-old forward called Carl Grimshaw, who had only previously tasted action at Bolton Lads and Girls club and Eagles FC - and that to simply help with a player shortage.

Now, just over 13 years on, dairy farmer Grimshaw, at the age of 38, has etched his name in club folklore by notching up an incredible 501 goals, reaching his latest milestone during the North West Counties League Premier Division club's recent defeat to Squires Gate.

Indeed, in 12 out of 13 seasons at Charnock Richard he has scored over 25 goals with his record tally being a sensational 50-goal season in 2012-2013.

Naturally, his success in front of goal has brought silverware too. His goals have helped take the Mossie Park clubs from Step 7 to Step 5, collecting no fewer than four West Lancashire League Premier Division championship Winners' medals and two runner-ups.

While Grimshaw will be humble enough to admit that the club's success was not solely down to his efforts, having a centre forward averaging 38 goals a season is a pretty solid platform in which to build a legacy.

Another prolific veteran on a hot streak right now is Brett Pitman.

Having forged a glittering career for himself in the Football League with the likes of AFC Bournemouth, Bristol City, Ipswich Town, Portsmouth and Swindon Town, Pitman is now enjoying a new lease of life at his local club AFC Portchester in the Wessex League.

In fact, that's something of an understatement as Pitman is currently the leading marksman in the top nine tiers of English football. His four goal blast for the Royals against Alresford Town last weekend took his tally to 28 in just 18 league and cup starts in 2022-23.

In all, his 14 Wessex League appearances have yielded 22 goals, scoring in every game but one, while 14 goals have come in his last six.

Naturally, it's a tally which is sparking a right Royal waltz at the top of the Wessex Premier with the Royals having collected 40 out of a possible 42 points to lead by eight going into this week's round of matches.

Frighteningly, Pitman is still only 34 years old and given that he's never really modelled his game on blistering pace and power, he may well be still at his peak.

"He's never going to run in behind defences, his movement in the box is brilliant, that's what he does," says Royals boss Dave Carter. "His movement to pull away from defenders is fantastic.

"It's not all about Brett, a lot of other lads are playing well. A lot of Brett's goals are put on a plate for him, but what he does is score goals at important times."

The value of having a top striker is not lost on Ashton United it seems.

The NPL Premier Division side audaciously attempted to lure goal machine Erling Haaland from Manchester City with Norway not in World Cup action.

A PR stunt, a stroke of genius or the height of ridiculousness, we'll let you decide but the point remains valid, the importance of having a top-class number nine in your ranks should never be undervalued.

Tyler Tobin – Goalkeeper signed from Ashford Town (Middlesex) in August 2019. Was a key member of the promotion chasing Uxbridge squad last season. A strong commanding goalkeeper who will once again be a key member of the squad for the upcoming season.

Matty Bonnett – Goalkeeper signed in the summer having previously seen service with Staines Town last season. Started his career at Slough Town.

Mark Goodman – Full back signed from Chalfont St Peter in July 2019. Also previously played for Wingate and Finchley at step 3. A powerful full back who will be key in both the attacking and defensive patterns for the club this season.

Lewis Patrick – Left sided full back who has signed for Uxbridge after a successful season at Risborough Rangers. A versatile defender who likes to get forward and put telling crosses into the box.

Elliott Poley – Young defender signed from Ashford Town (Middlesex) in July 2019. A centre half who is now in his fourth season at Uxbridge. He reads the game well and is confident in the air.

Ryan Haugh - Left sided defender signed from Harrow Borough in 2019. Strong in the tackle and a very good crosser of the ball, especially from set pieces. Ryan has previously played for Chalfont St. Peter, Beaconsfield Town & Barton Rovers.

David Sota – Left sided defender who always gives 100% for the team. David's previous clubs include Chesham United, Potters Bar Town and Edgware Town. Has had a few injury set-backs but looks to be returning to top form.

Alan Hedley - Signed from Chalfont St Peter in July 2019. Central defender who is equally at home in the defence or midfield. Strong tackler and whose experience and calmness will be vital this season.

Harry Seabrook – A central defender who signed this summer from Tring Athletic. Has also played for Bovington in the Spartan South Midlands League. Harry is strong in the air but also has the ability to bring the ball out from the back.

Luke Paris – Luke arrived this summer from Windsor. Centre back Luke can boast international experience playing for Anguilla in the World Cup.

Josh Andrew – A vastly experienced no nonsense right sided defender who has played for many clubs at this level. They include Harrow Borough, Ashford Town (Middlesex), Chipstead and Hayes & Yeading United.

Mark Bitmead – A talented player who consistently scores goals at this level. Previous clubs include Ashford Town (Middlesex) where he scored just shy of 100 goals in his time at the club. Good on the ball and an influential member of the squad for this season. Was part of the Chertsey Town squad which reached the play-off final last season. Second spell at Uxbridge after scoring 18 goals in 43 appearances first time around.

Baboucarr Jarra – Babz is a strong central defender both on the floor and in the air. Was Captain of Thatcham Town when they won the FA Vase Final at Wembley in 2018 and was also bestowed with the MOM award. Previously played for AFC Hayes (Brook House), Chalfont St. Peter, Swindon Supermarine, Cirencester Town, Hungerford Town, Harrow Borough, Marlow and Beaconsfield Town.

Jack Beadle – Jack has re-joined the club having played at Hanwell Town and Chipstead in recent seasons. He likes to take on defenders and put in crosses for the forwards and is no slouch in front of goal. Other previous clubs include Egham Town, Met Police and Ashford Town (Middlesex), where he forged a lethal partnership with Mark Bitmead.

Lonit Talla – Lonit is a product of the successful youth set-up at Uxbridge. An attacking midfielder who looks at ease on the ball and likes to link up play from defence to attack. Looks to have a big future.

Alex Witham – Alex is an attacking player who can play in midfield or in a striking role. A former Arsenal youth player and has played for Derby reserves. Previous clubs include Biggleswade Town, Wealdstone, Slough Town, Wembley, Leverstock Green, Northwood and Berkhamsted.

Victor Osobu – Victor was signed from Barton Rovers to strengthen the midfield and give the front line some options in attack. Victor is vastly experienced at this level and has previously played for Beaconsfield Town, Chesham United, Hemel Hempstead Town, Chalfont St. Peter, Ware, Canvey Island, Harrow Borough, Slough Town and Hayes & Yeading United. Quick feet and direct running make him a handful for defenders.

Kensley Maloney – A tricky midfielder with a good turn of pace. Joined Uxbridge last season after a brief stay at Marlow. Other previous clubs include Beaconsfield Town, Bracknell Town, Harrow Borough and Slough Town.

Andy O'Brien – Another new signing this season having played last season in the Hanwell Town side that gained promotion via the play-offs. Cultured defender who leads by example. Links play from the back to midfield and powerful in the air.

Jordan Ireland – Midfielder who arrives from Walton Casuals. Former Harrow Borough player whose vast experience at Step 3 will be valuable for The Reds as they push for promotion in 2022/23.

Joe Jackson – A big part of the Bedfont Sports side which reached the Play-offs in 2021/22. Midfielder who skippered The Eagles and scored the winning goal against Dulwich Hamlet in the FA Cup. Brings energy and creativity to the centre of the Uxbridge side.

Maurice Nugent - “Mo” spent seven successful seasons at Galway United in the League of Ireland, before re-locating to London with his work. A classy player who is equally at home in defence or midfield. Had a short spell at Hendon last season in the Southern League Premier Division.

Presley Evans - A young skilful midfielder who looks to have a bright future in the game. Another recent acquisition having joined Uxbridge from Grays Athletic where he was a member of their Under 23's side. At just sixteen years of age he scored four goals in nine appearances for the Essex club

Dan Williams - Dan has been amongst the goals at Step 4 for a number of seasons, netting around 50 at Chalfont St Peter, Tooting and Mitcham United and Bedfont Sports. Dan joined The Reds in September from Southern Premier South League neighbours Hendon. His goals last season helped propel The Sports into the playoffs.

Andy Ofosu - Experienced striker who was part of Bracknell Town's Championship winning side last season. Andy has also seen service at Staines Town, AFC Dunstable, Walton Casuals, Northwood, Berkhamsted and Hayes & Yeading United. Player who will add a cutting-edge to The Reds attack.

Scott Donnelly - Began his career at Queens Park Rangers in 2004. Has played for a number of clubs including Aldershot Town, Wycombe Wanderers, Havant & Waterlooville and Hayes & Yeading United. Vastly experienced attacking midfielder who was part of Hayes & Yeading United's promotion winning side. Joined the Reds in October from Beaconsfield Town.

Gareth Chendlik - Joined the Reds from local rivals Hanwell Town, where he was regularly amongst the goals. Popular player both on and off the pitch. His experience will be vital in our push for promotion.

Stephane Bombelenga - Forward who joined the club from East Grinstead Town. His pace and trickery make him a handful for defenders. Previous clubs include Gosport Borough, Eastbourne Borough and Leatherhead.

Management Team:

Danny Edwards – First Team Manager – Previously at Chalfont St Peter for 15 seasons as manager. Oversaw the club's promotion to step 4 and an FA Vase semi-final. Previously worked at Chelsea FC and Southampton FC and an UEFA A-Licence coach.

Fred Cummings – Assistant Manager - Joined Uxbridge from Chalfont St Peter. A UEFA B licence coach who has worked for Slough Town, Hemel Hempstead Town and Wealdstone. Played over 400 games for Uxbridge and a huge influence for the players.

Colin Finch – Logistics Manager / Club Secretary – The most important member of the group! Without Colin's support the group is unable to operate as professionally as it does. Responsible for all key issues in and around the changing room. Previously at Chalfont St. Peter, Rayners Lane & North Greenford United.

John Carroll – First Team Coach – Joined from Chalfont St Peter. A UEFA B licence coach who captained the successful Chalfont St Peter side that won promotion to step 4 football. Previous clubs include Beaconsfield Town and Luton Town

Luke Brooks-Smith – First Team Coach – Luke has joined us this season from Windsor and was previously a player at Chalfont St. Peter under Danny Edwards the current Uxbridge Manager. A UEFA B coach who leads the Uxbridge sessions and will be integral to the club's successes this season. Has spent 14 years as a coach with the Brentford Sports Trust.

Shaka Mughal – First Team Goalkeeping Coach – As a player Shaka played for Millwall and Chalfont St Peter. A huge influence and strong personality both on and off the training field. Shaka will also be responsible for 1st team full coaching sessions.

Shaun Ryan – First Team Coach - Has stepped up to the First Team coaching staff after managing the Under 23's last season and guiding them to a runners-up spot in the Suburban League Central Division.

Joseph Peacock – First Team Physio – Joined the club last season. An integral member of the management team. A fully qualified physio who gives players vital support on match days. Also responsible for players recovery and support after games.

Ki Turner – Videographer – Responsible for all recordings of Uxbridge FC games. Supports in and around all training sessions.

UXBRIDGE FOOTBALL CLUB - HISTORY

In the late 19th century the game of "football" was growing in popularity and on the 3rd February 1871 a group of eminent local businessmen held the inaugural meeting of Uxbridge Football Club. A local solicitor, Mr William Gardiner, was elected as the Club's President and the club's colours were chosen as white shirts with a light blue Maltese cross and a light blue velvet cap with silver tassel. Friendly games against local opposition were played in the early years, until the FA Cup was entered in 1873. A First Round Victory over Gitanos set-up a Second-Round tie against eventual finalists Royal Engineers, which the Engineers narrowly won 2-1. It was at this time that Uxbridge could boast amongst its ranks a Full England International. Hubert Heron played for England on two occasions whilst an Uxbridge player before he moved to Wanderers FC where he gained further international honours. His brother Francis, formerly of Uxbridge, also played for England after joining him at Wanderers FC.

The club changed its colours to Oxford Blue and Cambridge Blue shirts in 1874 but they were in financial difficulties and folded later that year. The main problem for Uxbridge was the lack of a permanent home ground (a problem that was to plague them until the middle of the next century), the committee searched the town for a suitable base but were thwarted at every turn and they led a nomadic existence, moving ground every few years. The enthusiasm for a team in Uxbridge was still prevalent and the Club was reformed in 1879. In 1886 Uxbridge FC amalgamated with another local club, Uxbridge Crescents, and played under this name in season 1886/87, before reverting to plain old Uxbridge the following season. It was at this time that the Red Shirts, which are still worn today, were adopted and the nickname "The Reds" was born. Their first trophy was won in 1889 when they lifted the West Middlesex Cup, defeating Colnbrook 1-0 in the Final. The end of the 19th century was a particularly successful period for The Reds as they won the West Middlesex Cup on three further occasions and also won the prestigious Middlesex Senior Cup twice. In 1894 they beat the 3rd Grenadier Guards 2-0 and repeated that success two years later with a 3-2 victory over local rivals Southall in a replay in front of over 5000 spectators. The outstanding achievement however was in reaching the final of the F.A. Amateur Cup in 1898. This was the club's first season in the competition and they had to win eight ties before meeting Middlesbrough in the final at Crystal Palace.

Unfortunately, their North East rivals proved too strong for them on the day and ran out 2-0 winners. During this successful period for the club they became founder members of Division Two of the Southern League in 1894, finishing fourth in their first four seasons. However, in season 1898/99 they finished next to bottom and the dwindling crowds (averaging around 500) meant that financially the club was once again in trouble. A decision was therefore taken to withdraw from the Southern League and join the local Middlesex League to try and stabilise the club. However, a majority of the more talented players joined other clubs and they struggled in their new surroundings, finishing bottom with only one point from their 14 games. At the end of the season the club had a deficit of £130 and with few players the club once again folded.

For two years much fund raising amongst the local community finally saw the club's debts paid and the reformed Uxbridge FC joined the West Middlesex League for the 1902/03 season. In 1904 the Great Western Suburban League was entered and here they stayed until the outbreak of the First World War. Their best finish during this period was as Runners-up to Brentford Reserves in 1910/11. They also won the Middlesex Charity Cup on two occasions in 1908 and 1913, as they looked to re-establish themselves as a force in the football world. Following the end of hostilities Uxbridge joined the Athenian League and added "Town" to their name. An unsuccessful first Athenian League campaign saw them relegated back to the Great Western Suburban League in 1920. A successful four seasons saw them back in the Athenian League in 1924 where they remained until 1937.

The Middlesex Charity Cup was won for the third time in 1935 as Finchley were beaten 4-3. Two poor seasons saw them finish bottom of the Athenian League in 1936 and 1937 and the club failed to be re-elected. They joined the Spartan League for the 1937/38 season, dropping "Town" from their name at the end of the campaign stood proudly at the summit.

Championship celebrations however were cut short when it was discovered that The Reds had played an ineligible player and were deduced six points, placing them in third position behind Champions Marlow. Following the debacle of their one and only season in the Spartan League they resigned and joined the London League prior to the Second World War.

During the war years they continued to play and joined the newly formed Great Western Combination League before re-joining the London League in 1945, finishing as Runners-up to Edgware Town. Uxbridge were founder members of the Corinthian League in 1946 and remained in this league for the next seventeen years. Finally, in 1948, after over three quarters of a century of searching, a ground of their own was purchased. A piece of land in Cleveland Road, Cowley was bought for £5,800 by then President Mr W.S. Try. The ground was named after a large house that stood on the land and "Honeycroft" was the new home of Uxbridge Football Club. During this period, they won their only Championship to-date when they were crowned Corinthian League Champions at the end of the 1959/60 season. They also won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the third time in 1951 when they defeated Hayes 2-1.

This was a successful period in the club's history as they finished in the top five of the Corinthian League on no less than eight occasions and crowds were averaging around the thousand mark. A re-organisation of non-League football saw the end of the Corinthian League in 1963 and club found itself once again in Division One of the Athenian League. This was a lean time for The Reds, they were relegated to Division Two in 1967 and financial problems once again beset them. They gained national publicity in 1976 when England were looking for a side to play as part of their warm-up for the forthcoming World Cup campaign. Uxbridge took on a full-strength England at Wembley, losing 8-0.

The ground problems that had blighted Uxbridge throughout their history surfaced once again and the club had to find a new home. In 1978 they moved to their current headquarters in Horton Road, Yiewsley. A former works Sports & Social Club they have developed the site to the superb standard you see today.

Over the past 43 years they have added floodlights (opened by the visit of Arsenal in 1981), new stands, fencing and in more recent times a new clubhouse was opened and car park laid. On the playing front the club won the Middlesex Charity Cup for the fourth time in 1982, their first silverware for 31 years, and moved to the Isthmian League in the same year, winning promotion to Division One in 1985. The Final of the AC Delco Cup (League Cup) was reached in 1986, where they met Premier Division Champions Sutton United. The Reds failed to stop Sutton completing "The Double" though, losing 3-1 in the Final in front of over a thousand spectators at Imber Court, the home of Metropolitan Police FC, Uxbridge entered the London Challenge Cup for the first time in the 1992/93 season and hence followed a love affair between the Reds and the magnificent trophy. In the eight seasons they entered the competition they reached five finals, winning on three occasions in 1994, 1997 and 2000.

They won the Middlesex Senior Cup for the fourth time in 2001, defeating Harrow Borough 3-0 in the Final held at Honeycroft. In 2004 the club were moved across the pyramid to the Southern League and have reached the Play-Offs on three occasions.

In 2004/05 they lost on penalties, after leading Maldon Town in extra-time, in 2007/08 they narrowly lost 0-1 at Oxford City and in 2011/12 they lost 2-1 at Bedworth United in the Semi-Finals. In 2018 Uxbridge were moved back across the pyramid, re-joining the Isthmian League in the South Central Division.

They have won the Middlesex Charity Cup on three more occasions in the last eight years. Defeating Brentford in 2013, Wembley in 2014 and Ashford Town (Middlesex) at Hanwell Town FC in 2019.

In the summer of 2016, the Club lost one of its stalwarts when long serving President Alan Odell passed away. Alan had been associated with The Reds for over 80 years, firstly as a supporter and player in his youth, before serving in various official duties as a committee member. He is sadly missed.

In 2019 Uxbridge appointed only their sixth manager over the past 51 years. Ron Clack was in charge for 18-years from 1970, followed by Peter Marshall for one season, Michael Harvey for three, before George Talbot took the reins for fourteen seasons in 1992. In 2006 Tony Choules became the man in charge, being replaced by our current manager Danny Edwards in 2019.

Danny is a UEFA A licensed coach who spent 15 years as manager of Chalfont St Peter AFC. He steered Chalfont St Peter to Step 4 of the league system in 2011, as well as reaching the 3rd Qualifying Round of the Football Association Challenge Cup on three occasions. Danny has with him a confident team which includes Fred Cummings as his Assistant Manager. Fred is well known to the followers of the Red Army as a combative centre half with 320 First Team appearances for Uxbridge in the 1980's.

Last season was the most successful in terms of league position since 2014/15 as we finished 6th missing out on the playoffs by one place we also won the Middlesex Charity Cup last season, beating Hanwell Town in the final, for the 4th time in the last 9 years

DOVER ATHLETIC PLAYER/MANAGEMENT PROFILES 2022/23

STUART NELSON

Experienced goalkeeper who made the move to Crabble in June 2022 after leaving League 2 Sutton United.

Nelson has made well over 500 appearances in his career including 223 for Gillingham during a five and half-year stay at Priestfield.

He joined the Gills from Notts County in 2012 and was a key man for Martin Allen's League 2 title-winning side, playing every game.

In Nelson's second season with Gillingham, he won the Player of the Season award.

After leaving Gills, Nelson signed for then League 2 Yeovil Town in 2018 and made 43 appearances for the Glovers during a two-year spell.

After starting his career with Cirencester Town, Nels joined Millwall in 2000 and had spells with Doncaster Rovers and Hucknall Town before joining Brentford in 2004, where he made 133 appearances for the Bees.

In 2007, he joined Leyton Orient for a year before leaving for Norwich City. One year in Norfolk was followed by a year with Scottish Premiership side Aberdeen.

Nelson then joined League 1 side Notts County, where he established himself as the first-choice goalkeeper, making 90 appearances before he joined Gillingham.

He also made three appearances for Crawley Town in the 20/21 season after leaving Yeovil.

ALFIE PAXMAN

Attacking full-back joined the club after leaving Folkestone Invicta in June 2022.

The former Dover Athletic Academy graduate made 60 appearances for Invicta last season, scoring 11 goals.

Two of his goals came in the 3-3 draw in the FA Cup fourth qualifying round tie at National League Eastleigh.

In his final season with Folkestone, Paxman won both the Supporters' and Player's Player of the Season awards as well as the Young Player of the Season award.

During his time at the Dover Academy, Paxman made one National League appearance, coming on as a second-half substitute in a 1-0 defeat against Forest Green Rovers at Crabble in April 2016.

WILL MOSES

Former Dover Athletic Academy defender who signed his first professional deal with the club in June 2021.

Moses made his National League debut as a 17-year-old away at Stockport County in October 2020.

MITCH BRUNDLE

Returned to the club in a new dule role in July 2022 as a player/assistant to manager Andy Hessenthaler.

The midfielder left Crabble for Dagenham & Redbridge in the summer of 2019.

During his first spell with Dover, Brundle made 99 appearances and scored 13 goals across all competitions for the club after arriving from Gateshead in May 2017.

He also captained the team and was named Supporters' Player of the Season and Away Supporters' Player of the Season at the end of the 2018/19 season.

Since leaving the Daggers, Brundle has played for Barnet and Farnborough.

JAKE GOODMAN

Former Millwall defender who orisigned for club in June 2021.

The 6ft 2in centre-back, who signed professional terms with the Lions in 2012, joined from Ebbsfleet United after making the move across Kent from Bromley.

He has plenty of National League experience to his name, having played a combined total of 117 games during time with Luton Town (loan), Aldershot Town (loan), Braintree Town, Maidenhead United, and Bromley.

He's also played League Two football for AFC Wimbledon while on loan from Millwall.

JORDAN HIGGS

Midfielder who arrived as manager Andy Hessenthaler's second summer signing in June 2022.

Higgs made 31 appearances in National League South for Dulwich Hamlet last season after joining them from Bromley.

A Bromley Academy graduate, Higgs made over 150 first-team appearances for The Ravens, including starting in the 2018 FA Trophy Final at Wembley Stadium.

LEE MARTIN

Former Manchester United and Gillingham attacking midfielder joined the club in July 2022 after spending two seasons at Ebbsfleet United.

The 35-year-old started his career in the youth ranks at Wimbledon before he signed for Manchester United in December 2003 after the Red Devils paid an estimated £1m for him.

While he was at Old Trafford, Lee had loan spells at Royal Antwerp, Rangers, Stoke City, Plymouth Argyle, Sheffield United, and Nottingham Forest.

After leaving United he made more than 100 appearances for Ipswich and also had a loan spell at Charlton Athletic during his time at Portman Road.

Lee has also played for Millwall, Northampton Town, and Gillingham, where he was captain for the 2017/18 campaign, and Exeter City.

He joined Ebbsfleet from Exeter in July 2020 after appearing more than 80 times in two seasons for the Grecians.

ALEX GREEN

Academy graduate who made one substitute appearance in the National League against Boreham Wood at Crabble last August.

The young defender missed the rest of the season through injury but is now back in the squad after signing a new contract in July.

TYRONE STERLING

The Grenada international defender signed for Dover for a second time in June 2022.

He made 114 appearances in all competitions for the club before leaving for Bromley in May 2017.

Sterling initially joined Whites from Dartford in the summer of 2014 and won both the Players' Player and Supporters' Player-of-the-Year awards in his first season.

Sterling has 16 international caps to his name, including two as captain, and played against the USA and El Salvador in the CONCACAF Nations League A earlier this summer.

He joins us after making 31 appearances for National League South side Dulwich Hamlet last season, scoring twice.

GEORGE NIKAJ

Academy forward who made his senior debut as a second-half substitute in the 1-1 National League draw with Kings Lynn Town at Crabble last April.

He scored his first goal for the club in the 4-1 defeat against Woking at Crabble and made six appearances all up.

Signed his first professional contract with the club last May.

LUKE BAPTISTE

Academy midfielder who put pen-to-paper on a professional deal with the club last April.

Made his senior debut as second-half substitute in the FA Trophy defeat against Bromley at Crabble last December.

Made his National League debut at FC Halifax Town last March and went on to make a further 10 appearances.

REECE GRANT

Forward who made the move to Crabble in July 2022 after spending last season with National League South champions Maidstone United.

The Greenwich-born Grant joined Maidstone last season from Ebbsfleet United.

He previously played Dagenham & Redbridge after signing from Aldershot Town for an undisclosed fee.

Grant joined the Shots from Braintree Town in November 2018 after winning promotion to the National League in 2017/18 with The Iron.

HARRISON BYFORD

Teenage right-back who made his debut after coming on as a second-half substitute in the 2-1 National League defeat at FC Halifax Town in March last season.

The Academy product went on to make a further five appearances and signed his first professional contract with the club last May.

MYLES JUDD

Former Leyton Orient defender who joined the club in January 2022.

The right-back made 66 appearances in all competitions for the O's.

A member of the O's team that won promotion from the National League in the 2018-19 season, Judd also played nine games while on loan at Barnet last season.

Judd came through the junior ranks at the East London Club and signed his professional deal with them in 2015.

At the end of the 2016/17 season, he won the LFE Apprentice of the Year for League Two, he played an integral part for his side that season, making 20 appearances in Sky Bet League Two.

NOAH CARNEY

Academy striker who signed his first professional contract with the club in June 2022.

The 18-year-old England Schoolboys International made nine National League appearances last season.

He also scored 15 goals in 10 games for the Academy team.

GEORGE WILKINSON

Teenage Dover Athletic Academy midfielder who signed his first senior deal with the club in January 2022.

The 18-year-old made his first start for Andy Hessenthaler's side in the 2-1 National League defeat at Wealdstone last January.

He went on to make a further 21 appearances, scoring once – a spectacular effort at Wrexham.

ARJANIT KRASNIQI

The former Kosovo under-21 captain signed for Dover in January 2022 after making 19 appearances and scoring two goals in National League South for Braintree Town last season.

He also scored twice in a 3-1 win for Braintree in the FA Trophy Second Round tie against Potters Bar Town last November.

Krasniqi was born and raised in London and has represented his father's native Kosovo at under-19 and 21 levels.

ALFIE PAVEY

Forward made the move to Dover a permanent one after leaving National League South champions Maidstone United in June 2022.

Pavey made 18 appearances for the club while on loan from Maidstone last season after making his debut in the 1-1 draw against Yeovil Town at Huish Park in November.

He scored six goals in his loan spell, with his final one coming in the 6-5 defeat at Wrexham.

The frontman is no stranger to Dover supporters after he scored 12 goals in 38 appearances for us in his previous spell at Crabble after arriving from Havant & Waterlooville in November 2018.

He left Dover to sign for Barnet for an undisclosed fee in September 2019 before joining Maidstone in June 2021.

After spending his youth career with Maidstone, where he scored 300 goals in three years for the Stones' academy and youth sides, Pavey earned a move to Championship side Millwall.

In his three years with the Lions, Pavey, had loan spells with Barnet, Bromley, Aldershot, Hampton and Richmond, and Dartford.

Following a brief spell with Welling United, Pavey returned to Dartford, scoring 28 goals in 38 matches and winning the National League South Player of the Season award.

He then joined promoted Havant & Waterlooville and scored four times in 19 appearances before making the move to Crabble.

LUKE WANADIO

Winger who signed for Dover in July 2022.

He finished last season with a short stint at Folkestone Invicta, scoring five goals in 15 appearances, including a hat-trick against Potters Bar.

The former Bromley, Aldershot, Welling, and Dartford wideman initially joined Invicta on loan in January after making six starts and six substitute appearances for Dartford, a team he had three spells with, before making the move a permanent one.

CHIKE KANDI

Former Dagenham & Redbridge, Aldershot Town, and Dulwich Hamlet frontman, who signed after impressing in pre-season.

He made over 100 appearances in all competitions in three seasons with the Daggers, including 78 in the National League, before joining Aldershot ahead of the 20/21 season.

Kandi, who came up through the youth ranks at Chelsea and Brighton, made 35 National League appearances during his time with the Shots before he made the move to Dulwich Hamlet last season, where he made 32 appearances for the National League South team.

MANAGER – ANDY HESSENTHALER

Whites' Gaffer was appointed manager for a second time in October 2018.

A combative midfielder on the pitch for the likes of Watford, Gillingham and Barnet, Hessenthaler had great success as Athletic's player-manager between 2007 and 2010, winning back-to-back promotions to take Dover from the Ryman South division to the Conference South.

After ending the 2009/10 season as runners-up in the second tier of non-league, Hessenthaler returned to Gillingham as boss for two campaigns, steering the Gills to two consecutive eighth-place finishes in League Two.

A third stint at Gillingham followed two seasons later, this time as assistant manager, a similar role he held at Leyton Orient the following year, before being made manager at Brisbane Road in 2016.

Dismissed by the O's later that same year, it wasn't long before Hessenthaler was back in football, joining Eastleigh before the start of the 2017/18 season, initially as assistant manager, before taking over from Richard Hill as boss just eight months after joining the club.

Hessenthaler left the Spitfires 15 games into the 2018/19 campaign to return to Dover following the departure of Chris Kinnear.



DOVER ATHLETIC FOOTBALL CLUB

CLUB HISTORY

Dover Athletic Football Club was formed in 1983 after the town's previous club, Dover FC, folded due to its debts.

The new club took Dover's place in the Southern League Southern Division, with former Dover player Alan Jones as manager and a team consisting mainly of reserve players from the old club.

Initially Athletic struggled, finishing second from bottom of the table in the 1984–85 season.

In November 1985 Steve McRae, who had succeeded Jones a year earlier, was sacked and replaced by Chris Kinnear.

Under Kinnear the club's fortunes turned round, with two top-five finishes followed by the Southern Division championship, and with its promotion, in the 1987–88 season.

The team started strongly in the Premier Division, finishing in sixth place at the first attempt, and then winning the championship in the 1989–90 season.

The club was denied promotion to the Football Conference, however, as the Crabble Athletic Ground did not meet the standard required for that league. After finishing fourth and second in the subsequent two seasons, Dover won the title again in the 1992–93 season and this time were admitted to the Conference.

Although Dover finished in eighth place in their first season in the Conference, the following season saw the club struggling against relegation, and Kinnear was replaced at the helm by John Ryan – but his reign was a short one and he was dismissed when the club lost seven of its first eight matches in the 1995–96 season.

The club then appointed former England international Peter Taylor as manager, but he was unable to steer the team away from the foot of the table, and Dover held onto their place in the Conference only because Northern Premier League runners-up Boston United failed to submit their application for promotion before the required deadline.

Bill Williams took over as manager in 1997 and proved to be Dover's most successful Conference manager, leading the club to the FA Trophy semi-finals in the 1997–98 season and a best ever league finish of sixth place in the 1999–2000 season.

Williams left the club to take a senior position with Conference rivals Kingstonian in May 2001. By now the club was in severe financial difficulties, with a number of directors resigning and debts exceeding £100,000. Amid the crisis the entire board of directors resigned, forcing the club's Supporters' Trust to take over the running of the club, and manager Gary Bellamy was sacked after just six months in the job.

Former Everton goalkeeper Neville Southall took over but was dismissed just three months later, with Clive Walker taking over in March 2002 with the club rooted to the foot of the table.

The club finished the season bottom of the Conference and was relegated back to the Southern League Premier Division. The club's ongoing financial problems led to it entering a Company Voluntary Arrangement (CVA), a process by which insolvent companies offset their debts against future profits, due to debts that were now estimated at £400,000.

In Dover's first season back in the Southern League Premier Division, the Whites finished in third place, albeit 17 points adrift of Tamworth, who claimed the one promotion place available that season.

A poor start to the following season saw Walker replaced by Richard Langley. Dover finished the season in 19th place, before being switched to the Isthmian League Premier Division in the summer of 2004 following a re-organisation of the English football league system.

The new season started with six successive defeats, which saw Langley sacked, and the financial problems continued, with the club coming within two months of being closed down.

Dover were relegated to the Isthmian League Division One at the end of the season but were saved from possible extinction in January 2005 when former director Jim Parmenter returned to head up a consortium that took over the club.

Parmenter quickly sacked manager Steve Browne and convinced Clive Walker to return to the club to replace him, and also arranged for the club's outstanding CVA debts to be cleared, putting the club on a firm financial footing for the first time in many years.

Dover Athletic narrowly missed out on an immediate return to the Premier Division in the 2005–06 season, reaching the play-offs for promotion but losing out to Tonbridge Angels.

The following season Dover again reached the play-offs but lost in the semi-final to Hastings United, after which Walker did not have his contract renewed and was replaced by former Gillingham manager Andy Hessenthaler.

In his first season in charge he led the club to the Division One South championship and promotion to the Isthmian League Premier Division. The following season Dover won a second consecutive championship and thus gained promotion to Conference South.

In the 2009–10 season, Dover reached the play-offs for promotion to the Conference National but lost at the semi-final stage to Woking.

The following season the club reached the third round of the FA Cup for the first time after wins over Kent rivals Gillingham in the first round and another League Two club, Aldershot Town, in the second round.

In the 2012–13 season the club again reached the play-offs, but this time lost in the final to Salisbury City.

The following season the team reached the second round of the FA Cup, losing 1–0 to Milton Keynes Dons, The last 16 of the FA Trophy, narrowly losing 3–2 to Eastleigh and made the play-offs once more. A 4–1 aggregate victory over Sutton United in the semi-final set up a match with fellow Kent team Ebbsfleet United in the final.

On 10 May 2014, Dover beat Ebbsfleet 1–0 at Stonebridge Road with a goal from Nathan Elder enough to seal the club's return to the top flight of non-league football for the first time since 2002.

In the 2014–15 season Dover went on another FA Cup run, beating Morecambe 1–0 in the first round, then Cheltenham Town 1–0 in the second round to reach the third round proper for only the second time ever, but lost 4–0 at home to Premier League side Crystal Palace.

The side went on to finish in 8th place in their first season back in the top-flight of non-league football.

The following season, Kinnear built on the good work done previously and guided the side to a 5th place finish in the Vanarama National League. The side faced Forest Green Rovers in the play-offs, losing 1-0 at home in the first leg before drawing 1-1 in Gloucestershire to suffer an undeserved exit from the play-offs.

Kinnear's side finished 6th in the 2016/17 season but finished the year with some silverware, after beating Welling United FC 2-0 in the Kent Senior Cup Final.

Chris Kinnear was replaced by Andy Hessenthaler in October 2018.

Hessenthaler's side was relegated from the National League in the 2021/22 season.
