ENFIELD TOWN FC: A BRIEF HISTORY

Formed on 23rd June 2001, Enfield Town FC started life in the Essex Senior League in 2001-02. The club finished runners-up in that first season before winning the league championship the following year. Their time spent in the ESL was successful, with two championships, two league cups, a Middlesex Charity Cup and wins in the Gordon Brasted Memorial Trophy and Capital Counties Feeder Leagues Trophy finals to show for their efforts.

After securing promotion to the Southern League (East) in 2005, the Towners had a successful first season at that level, before eventually losing to Wivenhoe Town in the promotion play-

offs. The following year, following a move into the Ryman League for 2006-07, the club again finished 3rd – this time losing out in the play-offs to AFC Sudbury. In 2009-10, the club yet again only just missed out on promotion, being beaten this time by Concord Rangers in the play-off final.

The club originally played at Brimsdown Rovers' Goldsdown Road in a ground share arrangement. But in October 2008, the London Borough of Enfield announced a deal with the club which paved the way for it to relocate to the Queen Elizabeth II Stadium. Realising a long-held dream, the club worked closely with the Council to see the old athletics arena restored and upgraded to be able to host Isthmian League football. At last the club had a home of its own, a short distance from the former Enfield FC stadium in Southbury Road.

While retaining a running track as a training facility for local use, the club has been able to provide an atmospheric environment. The Stadium was formally opened in November 2011 with a match against a Tottenham Hotspur XI.

Following the move to the new ground, after finishing as Ryman League Division One (North) runners-up under manager Steve Newing, Town overcame Grays Athletic and Needham Market in two very close play-off matches to secure promotion to Step 3. Subsequently, after aiming for a period of consolidation, safety was only guaranteed on the final day of the 2013-14 campaign with a 2-1 win at Cray Wanderers.

Bradley Quinton succeeded George Borg as first team manager in August 2014 and, such was the team's improvement that a play-off place was achieved, only for three crucial points to be deducted in controversial circumstances towards the end of the campaign which consequently led to a final league placing of 7th.

In 2015-16, the side embarked upon an impressive late run, but missed out on a play-off spot by two points. Then in 2016-17, the club's Premier Division play-off dream was realised, but a 2-4 reverse at Dulwich Hamlet in the semi-final put paid to further progress.

Following the departure of Quinton to Braintree Town, Andy Leese took over the managerial reins for the 2017-18 season, and the club subsequently progressed to the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup, taking National League outfit Maidstone United to a replay. The Velocity Trophy (Isthmian League Cup) was won for the first time in April 2019.

The first supporter-owned club in the country, growth continues at a sustainable pace. Over the years, successful Reserve, Under-23, Under-18 and Ladies sides have been built, alongside other teams of various age groups and abilities, including a learning difficulties squad.

ENFIELD TOWN FC: A BRIEF HISTORY

In June 2017, the club were awarded the Charter Standard Community Club of the Year by the Middlesex Football Association, one of a number of awards to recognise all the hard work being done to support the local community. In November 2017 a 3G training facility was opened adjacent to the club's stadium. This London Borough of Enfield project was made possible with a grant via the Football Foundation and is used primarily by Enfield Town FC as well as a range of local schools and other clubs. Subsequently, Enfield Town FC Community Sport Development Ltd, a not-for-profit organisation run independently of the football club, was formed to support local community activities, which currently include football schools, holiday clubs, disability football and walking football. In the summer of 2018, the QEII Stadium hosted eight matches (including the final) of the Confederation of Independent Football Associations (CONIFA) Football World Cup.

The club continues to build on the on and off-field momentum that has been established over the past few seasons as it pursues its vision as an inclusive club for all and a football and social centre for the community, with a range of teams playing at the highest sustainable levels possible.

ENFIELD TOWN FC: 2019-20 SQUAD PEN PICTURES

Nathan McDonald (Goalkeeper) 28-year-old Nathan signed from Braintree Town for his first spell at the club in the summer of 2014 and went on to be an ever-present in the league for three years. An England C international, he moved back to Braintree in time for the 2017-18 season, helping them to promotion via the play-offs. He switched to Chelmsford City in August 2018 before a move back to the QEII Stadium in May of this year. His other previous clubs include AFC Sudbury, Cambridge United and Southend United.

Tyler Forde (Goalkeeper) 20-year-old Tyler arrived at the club from West Ham United, where he had signed a scholarship in 2016 and gone on to make a number of Under 18 team appearances.

Jon Muleba (Defender) 24-year-old Jon started his career in the youth ranks at Chelsea before joining AFC Bournemouth's Under 21 squad. He had loan spells at Poole Town, Gosport Borough and Bishop's Stortford before joining Folkestone Invicta in July 2016. Shortly afterwards he moved to Enfield Town, making 45 appearances, before following manager Bradley Quinton to Braintree Town in the summer of 2017. After playing a key role in the Iron's 2017-18 promotion campaign, he moved on to Kingstonian in February 2019 before committing to Town in the close season.

Joe Payne (Defender) Joe originally joined Town from Barnet on loan in March 2019. He had been at the Hive since 2010, graduating through the youth set-up to make his first team debut against Peterborough United in the Checkatrade Trophy in November 2016, shortly after signing a professional contract. Primarily a left-back who can also play centrally, he scored on his Town debut in a 3-1 win at Whitehawk, before penning a permanent deal in the summer.

Marc Weatherstone (Defender) A December 2018 arrival, Marc had moved to Dulwich Hamlet in the summer of 2016 after nine years and over 400 appearances for Wingate & Finchley, where he had been club captain. After helping Hamlet to promotion, he returned to Summers Lane to break the W&F appearances record when he turned out for the club for the 452nd time at Potters Bar Town last November. He started his career as a youngster at West Ham United and then had spells at Barnet, Luton Town and Dagenham & Redbridge.

ENFIELD TOWN FC: 2019-20 SQUAD PEN PICTURES

Glenn Wilson (Defender) A summer arrival, Glenn is a vastly experienced centre-back who can also play in any other position defensively. He has previously played for AFC Hornchurch, AFC Wimbledon, Rushden & Diamonds, Kidderminster, Crawley, and Fleetwood amongst others. Aged 33.

Sam Hatton (Defender) Sam is an experienced player who has represented clubs such as AFC Wimbledon, Aldershot Town, Grimsby Town and Welling United. An England C International, he signed for Town in time to make his competitive debut in a 3-2 win at Folkestone Invicta on the opening day of last season. He can also operate in midfield.

Junior Mubiayi (Defender/Midfield) A young utility player, Junior has progressed through the youth ranks at the QEII Stadium, and he stepped up to the first team squad in 2017-18, scoring his first goal for the club in a 2-2 draw at Dorking Wanderers in April 2018. He has also had experience at Hertford Town.

Lewis King (Defender) Formerly with Wormley Rovers, Lewis featured for Town pre-season and made his competitive debut in October against Northwood in the Middlesex Senior Cup. He has been on a dual-registration with SSML Premier club Harpenden Town this season.

Ryan Blackman (Midfield) 24-year-old Ryan signed for Witham Town in August 2014, having been spotted playing for Tilbury as a teenager. He moved on to Waltham Abbey, where he became captain and then joined Canvey Island, also as skipper, in November 2016. He had also had experience at Biggleswade Town prior to his move to QEII in June 2017 and is fast approaching 100 competitive appearances for the club.

Scott Thomas (Midfield) Formerly with Hemel Hempstead Town, Chesham United, Boreham Wood and St Albans City, 29-year-old Scott made the short move from Boreham Wood, where he had won promotion to the National League, to St Albans in August 2015. He was subsequently on a dual registration arrangement with Royston Town for a spell and featured in the Crows team that overcame Town 2-0 in the FA Trophy in October 2017. He also featured as a defender during his St Albans days.

Sam Youngs (Midfield)

A former Chesham United player, Sam, 28, originally made his Generals' debut at Didcot Town in March 2011, and then, after a spell away, returned to the Meadow in the summer of 2015. He has enjoyed three spells at Rugby Town, including scoring a dozen goals in season 2012/13, and has also spent time at Redditch United, Hemel Hempstead Town, Banbury United, Ware and Halesowen Town. He made his 100th Town appearance in August.

Lewis Taaffe (Midfield)

Lewis, 28, returned to Concord Rangers in July 2017 after spells at Hemel Hempstead Town and Billericay Town. He went on to make over 150 appearances for the Beachboys and was a firm fans' favourite with his energetic style. He has also had experience with Leyton Orient and Histon and joined Town at the start of last season.

ENFIELD TOWN FC: 2019-20 SQUAD PEN PICTURES

James Potton (Midfield) 29-year-old wide player James was originally released by Watford at U16 level and had a spell with Hemel Hempstead reserves before going off to university. Upon his return he joined Chesham United, playing 186 games in a four-year stint, scoring 55 goals. He moved back to Hemel in 2014 and subsequently spent several seasons at Conference South level, including netting for the Tudors in a 2014-15 FA Cup 1-3 first round exit at Bury, before a move to Royston Town in June 2017. He signed for Town in July, and unfortunately sustained a serious knee injury in August, which has almost certainly ended his season.

Nathan Livings (Midfield) Nathan recently returned to the Town, having made over 100 appearances during his first spell. Prior to his initial move to the QEII Stadium in 2014, he had experience with Concord Rangers, East Thurrock United, Chelsea, Bristol City, Sollefteå GIF (Sweden) and Bishop's Stortford. He has most recently worn the colours of Harlow Town and AFC Hornchurch.

Bobson Bawling (Midfield) 24-year-old Bobson joined the Watford academy after being released by Chelsea in 2008, and he progressed through the various age groups before spending some time on loan at Wealdstone in December 2013. After leaving Watford at the end of the 2013-14 season, he penned a one-year deal at Crawley Town, making his league debut as a sub during a 1–0 win at Barnsley in August 2014. In May 2017, it was announced that he had signed for Woking. Then in August 2017, during Woking's 4–1 home victory over Torquay United, he scored his first ever professional goal. The following season he joined Torquay United, before going on loan to Oxford City, the move being made permanent in November 2018. He then had a brief spell at St Albans City earlier his season.

Kyle Lynch (Midfield) Kyle has been playing for the Under 23s for a couple of seasons and has been involved with the first team squad this season, making his debut against Broadfields United in the Middlesex Charity Cup in November.

Billy Bricknell (Forward) Enfield-born Billy, 31, moved from Chelmsford City to Billericay Town in November 2016, having previously had a stint at Dover Athletic. As well as a couple of spells with Billericay, he has also appeared for Leyton, Ebbsfleet United and Maidstone United. He netted his 250th career goal in November 2018.

Ken Charles (Forward) Teenager Ken was released by Colchester United at the end of last season. He had previously represented Cray Wanderers, Erith Town and Maidstone United.

Charles Brown (Forward) 20-year-old Charles signed at the start of the season after a spell in Essex youth and intermediate football, making his first appearance as a trialist in a 2-0 pre-season victory against a Spurs XI.
